

Remarks On Board Ship Conithian

Dec 1868

438 Monday 20th Bore with light air from E the
Passant ship on the East side of the Delancey
Delancey boat saw shore a trading for 1000 and
20 Pigg cocoanuts. Miaaco sail light from the
5000. Bore at 6 P.M. made all sail steering around to
the N.W. part of the Delancey. Latter part light
wind from the N.E. steering N.W. at 9 A.M.
lost sight off the Delancey and the bar

439 Tuesday 21st Bore with light wind from N.E.
to N.W. some rain squalls steering N.W.
by compass. Miaaco sail. Latter part
light wind from the E and N.E. steering
N.W. by compass. Lat 11° 26' N
Long 165° 29' E

440 Wednesday 22nd Bore with light wind from
the E steering N.W. fine pleasant weather
Made port light wind from the E and N.E.
Latter part the same. Lat 2° 55' N
Long 164° 06' E

441 Thursday 23rd Bore with light wind from
made the N.E. and N the ship on the North and
Boys River. Neston tack. Miaaco sail. Latter part fresh
2 Pairs of rain from the N.E. and N the ship on
Santo the North and Neston tack some rain
squalls and unpleasant. Lat 4° 42' N
Long 162° 31' E

442 Friday 24th Bore with fresh wind from the
N.E. and fresh squalls the ship on the North
and Neston tack. Miaaco sail. Latter part light Gale
from the E and N with fresh rain squalls.
Latter part light Gale from the E and N steering
N.W. by N. Lat 6° 18' N
Long 161° 27' E

While On Year Neston Cruise 1868

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443 Saturday 25th Bore with fresh wind from
the E. N.E. steering N.W. by compass at 3 P.M.
made all sail. Miaaco sail. Latter part at sundown took
in sail and luffed to the wind for the night.
Latter part light Gale from N.E. some rain
No Askins squalls at 6 P.M. made all sail steering S.W.
Delancey for M. Askins Delancey at 8 A.M. luffed to
under the lee of the Delancey but no more
came on Board. made sail for Dupree Delancey
Lat 6° 21' N

444 Sunday 26th Bore with light Gale from N.E. and
fresh squalls of rain steering N.W. by N. made
Dupree all sail at 3 P.M. raised the Delancey at 5 P.M.
Delancey the boat came on Board 2 white men and
the King at 6 P.M. the Starboard Boat went
on shore and the Port Boat picked for the
30 Pigg right. Miaaco sail. Latter part fresh wind from N.E.
16 Delancey and some rain squalls. Latter part wind
11 chinking and weather the same the ship off and
500 on the Delancey for Recruits at 8 A.M. the
Cocoanuts Boat came on Board with 30 Pigg at 9 A.M.
2 P.M. of 2 boats went in for Cocoanuts
1 of Bread Fruit

445 Monday 27th Bore with light Gale from
N.E. the ship off and on at 6 P.M. the Boat
left came on Board with all the Recruits
at 8 P.M. the Boat went in to deliver the
Hercules. Trapping Master on shore. Miaaco sail. Latter part
Delancey 11 P.M. the Boat came on Board made sail
steering N.W. by N. Latter part at 8 A.M. raised
Hercules Delancey at 11 A.M. the Pilot came
on Board and took the ship in. Miaaco sail
saw and came to Anchor in 6 fathoms
of water the John Barber and Brigg
Command of Honolulu in Port. It ends
in Rainy and Bad weather
