

Remarks Log On Board Ship Cornuthian

Feb 1868

477 Friday 28th Come with fresh wind from N. N. W. the ship on the Starboard tack and a heavy swell from N. E. and unpleasant. Miaa's part light Gale from W. and N. E. and N. W. the ship on opposite tacks. Latter part fresh wind and unsteady varying 4 points N. N. W. to N. W. the ship on the Starboard tack with a very strong current setting to the N. E. or N. N. E. the land 2 points in sight bearing N. N. W. distant 40 miles the boat employed in various jobs Lat 29° 49'

478 Saturday 29th Come with fresh wind and force the unsteady from N. N. W. to N. W. the land in prospect bearing N. W. by N. distant 40 miles a strong Gale current setting N. N. E. the ship on the South by East and Starboard tack Miaa's part light wind from the N. the ship on 2 hours tacks waiting for daylight Latter part strong wind from the N. N. W. and N. W. the ship on the Starboard tack under all sail with a strong S. E. current at 11 A. M. the land went out of sight bearing N. N. W. Lat 29° 18' N

479 Sunday 1st Come with light Gale from the N. N. steering S. W. by S for a southern passage through into the Eastern sea. Miaa's part fresh wind from the N. E. the ship under all sail steering S. W. by S Latter part wind the same and Merchant 7 A. M. hauled to the Westward for the land at 11 A. M. came up to Long Island and passed through it between 2 Islands that was about 30 miles apart to the North of Long Island saw 1 Barque bound to the N. and Eastward with no main top Gallant Mast Lat 28° 34' N

480 Monday 2nd Come with fine wind from East 6 P. M. Sulphur Island bearing E. N. E. distant 4 Leagues steering N. Miaa's part light wind from the E. steering N. N. E. Latter part light Gale from S. E. and N. E. over east no sun in a number of Clouds and Hummocks no sun

481 Tuesday 3rd Come with fresh Gale from S. E. steering N. by E under all sail thick haze. I. B. later weather at 6 P. M. took in sail Miaa's part at 7 P. M. luffed to on the S. Starboard tack fresh Gale at midnight took in Fore & Mizzen top sails Latter part wind from the Westward at 9 A. M. made some sail the ship on the Northern tack under close reef top sail Lat 30° 52' N

482 Wednesday 4th Come with light Gale from N. the ship on the Northern tack under double reef top sails Miaa's part fresh Gale from N. W. at 7 P. M. took in the Fore and Mizzen top sails Latter part the same the ship on opposite tacks at 8 A. M. set the fore and Mizzen top sails the wind the same Lat 30° 32' N

483 Thursday 5th Come with light Gale from the N. N. E. the ship on the N. Starboard tack I. B. Boat under double reef top sails Miaa's and Ripping Latter part light wind from the N. E. and E under top the ship on opposite tacks Lat 31° 04' N

484 Friday 6th Come with light wind from the E. and cloudy weather some little rain. Miaa's and Latter part light Gale from the North and rain and unpleasant the ship on the Eastern tack under close and double reef top sails no sun
