486 Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> Come with fresh Gale from the broke out the ship on the Easton tack at 3 P. M. raised for Mut the Land bearing E by N called Boche Boche 2<sup>d</sup> watered Miaad and Latter part light wind from the N. the ship on opposite tack under all sail sail see nothing fine weather Lat 31.03 N Long 128.30 E

487 Monday 9<sup>th</sup> Come with light wind from the ship on opposite tack under all sail fine weather Miaad part light wind from the N. and some rain Latter part call Maud light wind from the E the ship on the Easton tack at 7 A. M. raised the land call Duty the Asteers the watch employed in Repairing the Main Royal Yard and sail Lat 31.39 N

488 Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> Come with fresh wind from the Island the E. S. E. steering N by N at 4 P. M. the Islands bearing E. Rainy and unpleasant weather the ship under easy sail Miaad part and Latter part fresh Gale from all points of the compass and plenty of rain and unpleasant weather the ship close reef Top sails at 11 A. M. took in fore and Mizzen Top sails Lat 32.29

490 Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> Come with light wind from the E. N. E. the ship on the Northon tack at 2 P. M. raised Buell part Island bearing N. N. W. by saw light Corn pass Miaad and Latter part light on Shore Gale from the E the ship on the opposite tack of and on the Land Lat 33.27 N

E. some rain steering N. E. by E at 3 A. M. wind S. E. luffed to the rain on the East on tack Latter part fresh Gale from the Land rain steering N. E. it thick and rainy no sun

M. more ship to Land West ward at 5 P. M. the wind shifted to the N. S. W. at 6 P. M. it cleared up some saw the Land on the North and Passed West side of the Straits Miaad part through the ship on the opposite tack wind N. N. W. the Strait Latter part fresh wind from N. N. W. fainting at daylight made sail and entered L. O. Boat the Straits at 11 A. M. on the North side of the Straits Lat 34.07 N
