

Remarks Pass On Board Ship Corinthian

March 1868

493 Sunday 15th Come with light wind from the N steering N N E along the land saw a number of Banks steering to the Northward Micaad and Latter part light wind from the E the ship on opposite tacks working along the coast to the North saw some Brigg and a plenty of Fish Boats at 11 A M boarded some of the boats and got a few Fish Lat 35° 55'

1594 Monday 16th Come with light wind from spoke the N. N. E the ship working along the coast Brigg Mica to the Northward at 1 P M spoke the Brigg Mica I think a Russian vessel Mica a part Bragg light wind from the E and N E fine weather and Butter Latter part light Gales from N and N W Mollard the watch employed in breaking out for Butter and Bread Lat 36° 09'

495 Tuesday 17th Come with light gales from the E the ship on the Northern tack Micaad part light Gales the ship on the Northern tack Latter part light wind from the E N E Island rain and snow Daglets Island in broke but sight to the North Lat 37° 25' N Long 130° 16' E

496 Wednesday 18th Come with light wind from Land the N and fine weather the ship on Western tack the Main Land in sight to the Westward at sundown took in some sail Micaad and cleaning Latter part light air and calms the watch employed the Mica in cleaning the Micaad the land in sight and Latter the Brigg Lat 37° 40' N Long 130° 02' E

On Cruise In Japan Sea 1868

497 Thursday 19th Come with light wind from N W and N steering E. N. E the Brigg in sight the latter the Island in sight sailing E Micaad part light air and calms Latter part light wind from N W Micaad steering E N E pleasant weather Lat 37° 52' N Long 130° 07' E

498 Friday 20th Come with fine wind from S steering East sight E by N N lost sight of the Brigg and Daglets of Daglets Island Micaad and Latter part fine wind from S and S S N steering E. N. E. Lat 39° 24' N Long 134° 13' E

499 Saturday 21st Come with fine wind from S S W steering E. N. E nothing in sight pleasant weather Micaad light Gales at 1 P M luffed to the Fresh Gales Eastward under a double reef Cop sails Latter part fresh Gales from the S and rain the ship under close reef Main Cop sail on the Western tack

500 Sunday 22nd Come with fresh Gales from the S the Spinnaker and S. S. N. at 4 P M we drenched some wind East-broke S N at 6 P M wore ship to the S. S. E. Micaad part at 10 P M set the Fore and Main Rods top sails close reef Latter part light wind the Corinthian from the N. N. W. the ship steering different with a whole caused a heavy swell from S N and a cloudy over cast in nothing

501 Monday 23rd Come with light wind from N W the ship on different tacks a heavy swell from the N Micaad and Latter part strong wind from the N. N. E saw some sulphur Bottom Lat 40° 00' N Long 136° 43' E
