532 Friday 17th Come with fine wind from
Put out the weathering with by N fine weather
cutting stage. Micae part first part light wind from
the N. N. W. Latter calm. Latter part light
wind from S E and caught the water keel
in putting out the stage Lat 57° 00' N
Long 171° 20' E

533 Saturday 18th Come with light air and calm
Repair the at 3 P. M. fresh wind from the N E and a
fine top sail plenty of snow looking the light with Micae
& fine sail part wind N W the ship on opposite tack and
at 7 P. M. all sail. Latter part light wind from N W to
a fresh N E the ship on opposite tack Lat 57° 38' N
Long 171° 38' E

534 Sunday 19th Come with light air and calm
broke out some snow no whales. Micae part light wind
from the S steering N by N. Latter part fine
pleasant weather wind from S to S W steering
N by N Lat 58° 34' N
Long 170° 00' E

535 Monday 20th Come with light wind from
S W steering N W and N by compass
Micae and Latter part light wind from S W
and fine pleasant weather steering N and
N E at 3 A. M. raised the Cape of Oglouton by being
at distant 20 miles plenty of ice a cloudy
over cast plenty of birds and whales

536 Tuesday 21st Come with light wind from the
S W steering N E along the land pleasant
weather at 2 P. M. left the last point of ice
Micae part light air from the S and S W
steering N E Latter part light wind from
N E and some snow the ship of and the ice
a cloudy over cast

While On Her Northan Cruise 1868
April 1868

537 Wednesday 22nd Come with light wind from
the N E at 3 P. M. tacked off from the ice
and land thick cloudy over cast
Micae part light air and calm
Latter part light air from the S to S W
steering N E no one sail in sight as the
wake in coming up very fast no sun

538 Thursday 23rd Come with calm at 3 P. M. a breeze
spring up from the W steering along the ice and
center to the North and Eastward Micae
part light wind from the N S W at 9 P. M. took in
some sail and lay with the main yard aback on
opposite tack in the dark part of the night none
Bk. Monticello Bk. in sight Latter at 3 A. M. made sail steering
N. N. E at 6 A. M. the ice brought us up braced up
the yards and worked to the South out of the
ice at 10 A. M. the Bk. Monticello low 3 boats I
think for a whale Lat 60° 47' N
Long 173° 08' E

539 Friday 24th Come with light wind from the S W
steering along the ice to the Southward trying to
get around the ice to the North and Eastward
the Monticello in sight Micae and Latter part light
wind and fine weather wind from the S W and
2 sail the ship working to the North and Eastward
along the ice a cloudy over cast the most of the
time to Bk. in sight

540 Saturday 25th Come with light wind from the
E to N E the ship working to the E and Northward
2 Bk. in sight and a plenty of ice Micae part fresh
wind from the E the ship working to the East
ward along the ice Latter part light wind from
the E the ship on the North and Eastward tack
the land in sight and 11 ships
