550 Tuesday 5th Came with light winds from N
29 ships the ship hove to the Northward at 4
8 a boiling P.M. the wind came out N.E. with snow at
6 P.M. the ship on the Southern Easton tack and
and took in sail quite a heavy swell from S and
unpleasant Miasma and latter part light
gales from the S.E. to E.N.E. and plenty
of snow the ship blocked in the ice and
drifting to the N along the coast 13 ships
in sight in the ice the ice quite heavy

551 Wednesday 6th Came with fresh winds from
the E and N.E. at 4 P.M. the weather cleared
of the land about 5 miles distant and a 18th ship
and of water and a heavy swell from S at 6
P.M. light winds from N.E. Made all sail and
put out Ice Anchor and began to haul the
ship of shore to the Southward Miasma part
at 11 P.M. the ice opened some so the ship
lost some men and some head way under sail at 3 A.M.
copper and came out into the scattering ice with the
part of the loss of part of the cut water and a good deal
one foot of copper latter part fresh winds from N all
of the ships in the scattering ice bound to the East

swell from the S.E.
