

Remarks Pass On Board Ship Cornthian

May 1868

557 Monday 11th Come with wind from the NE Boiling and a thick snow storm the ship steering out of the Dec to the South and Westward. Miacaw part fresh wind from the NE and 34th ship plenty of snow at 10 P.M. called across the ship off no whales and in the Dec. Latter part fresh wind from the NE a clear the watch employed in Boiling.

558 Tuesday 12th Come with light wind from the NE Boiling and very cold the ship working up to the Dec to the N. N. W. Miacaw and Latter part light wind from the E and NE at 7 A.M. made sail steering along the Dec to the South and Eastward a plenty of ship but no whales.

559 Wednesday 13th Come with light wind from the NE steering to the South and Eastward along Boiling the Dec give pleasant weather at 1 P.M. finish Boiling Miacaw and Latter part light wind from E to NE the ship running along the Dec to the S. 4 ships in sight all having employed in stowing across in the Main Hatch at 11 P.M. Main Hatch finish made all sail.

560 Thursday 14th Come with light wind from E S E to NE the ship running along the Dec Molasses to the Southward thick cloudy overcast no sun Miacaw part fresh wind from the E S E to E N E the ship off and on the Dec working to the Eastward ship St. George in company. Latter part the same.

May 1868

561 Friday 15th Come with light gales from E S E to E N E the ship off and on the Dec working to the Eastward a heavy swell from E Miacaw part light gales from the E and E N E the ship on opposite tacks by the Dec. Latter part light wind from the E N E and NE at 9 A.M. spoke the ship St. George and had a haul it was cold no sun plenty of Dec and ships.

562 Saturday 16th Come with light wind and a heavy swell from SE the ship on the Easton tack at 5 P.M. spoke the ship St. George from the Southward. Miacaw part at 8 P.M. broke up the haul made all sail wind at the ship on the Easton tack. Latter part light wind from the N and N W at 11 A.M. came up to scattering Dec the ship on the North and Easton tack.

563 Sunday 17th Come with light wind from the N N W the ship on the North and Easton tack in the Dec the St. George in company 3 ships in sight saw 2 Rip-sacks Miacaw and Latter part light wind and caters working to the N E in the Dec at 11 A.M. came up to quite thick Dec worked ship to the S N the wind S E at 11 A the St. George spoke us 3 ships in sight.

564 Monday 18th Come with light wind from S E the ship laying aback in the Dec on opposite tacks thick cloudy weather 3 sail in sight Miacaw and Latter part light wind from all points of the compass the ship in the Dec under easy sail at 7 A.M. made sail steering N E and E N E the wind from S E and E N E.
