

Remarks Log On Board Ship Comethian

June 1868

580 Wednesday 3rd Com with light wind from Boiling all points of the compass the boats down after whaled the Larboard boat May Hook some a slight chance saw 2 Bk take whales at 6 P M the Boats came on Board we had Miace part light wind from the E Latter part fresh gales from the E and snow at 10 A M 100⁰ in sail to a short reef Main top sail and Fore stay sail saw a number of ships

581 Thursday 4th Com with fresh gales from E and snowing the most of the time at 2 P M Boiling fresh Boiling Miace part fresh gales from E and snow the ship in scattering Ice Latter part fresh wind from the E and a heavy swell from the S E the watch employed in pumping fresh water to get ready to stow down the ship in the scattering Ice saw 1 whale

582 Friday 5th Com with light wind from the E snowing and snow the most of the time a heavy swell from S E the ship doing the Ice all hands 162 Bk employed in stowing down Oil saw 5 ships Miace and Latter part wind light from the E to N E plenty of snow and thick weather

583 Saturday 6th Com with light wind from Boiling the N at 1 P M spoke the Bk Endent 1 whale a thick snow storm at 3 P M 100⁰ 2 Boats broke out for whales but did not see them again some for small rain and snow Miace and Latter part light gales from the E plenty of rain and snow very unpleasant Lat 64.34 N

June 1868

584 Sunday 7th Com with fresh wind from the stormy E S E and a thick snow storm most of the time the ship under easy sail laying aback the most of the time Miace and Latter part the same snow and fog no sun

585 Monday 8th Com with light wind from N E at 1 P M the fog light some near some sail at 3 P M 100⁰ 2 Boats for a whale but no chance at 4 P M wind N N W and a heavy swell from S Miace and Latter part light wind from the N W and some fog the ship in the scattering Ice at 8 A M spoke the ship Milo and heard a game

586 Tuesday 9th Com with light air and calm and thick fog the most of the time gaining with the ship Milo at 4 P M broke up the game thick fog Miace and Latter light air from the S and all points of the compass a thick fog the most part of the time at 9 A M Capt. Walves of the ship Milo came on Board Lat 64.32 N Long 177.00 W

587 Wednesday 10th Com with light air from the N and fine pleasant weather steering to the Southward in the Ice Miace part light wind from N W steering E and E N E thick fog the most of the time Latter part light wind from N W steering N E at 3 A M 100⁰ 2 and 1 whale at 7 A M took one of them along side at 8 A M took the other round fine pleasant weather cape Berhing in sight Barling N and a number of sails the Miller snow cutting at 11 A M finish cutting none of the whales
