

Remarks Pass On Board Ship Cornishian

June 1868
588 Thursday 11th Corn with light airs and calms at 6 P.M. finish cutting and started the pumps at 8 P.M. set the watch at 9 P.M. wind and thick fog. Mian's part thick fog the most of the time the ship laying at anchor. Latter part no fog but Boiling a cloudy over cast saw 2 ships the ship working to the S and Eastward along the Ice the wind no sun

589 Friday 12th Corn with light wind from the S and a cloudy weather at 5 P.M. it came in foggy the ship working to the S and Eastward along the Ice Mian's part light wind from the S and a thick fog some snow. Latter part calms at 9 A.M. the fog light up Boiling saw the S and East from Cape Berhing and 15-20 ships at 11 A.M. finish Boiling the ship in the small Ice Lat 64° 15' N Long 174° 34' W

590 Saturday 13th Corn with pleasant weather and land calms the land in sight to the East of Cape Berhing and 15-20 ships the watch employed in scraping Bone and coopers Oil Mian's and latter part light airs from S and calms all hands employed in stowing down Oil at 8 A.M. four boats to tow the ship clear of the Ice the land in sight but cloudy weather saw a number of ships Lat 64° 11' N

591 Sunday 14th Corn with light airs and calms all hands employed in stowing down Oil 113 Bbls Native Men in the After Watch Mian's part light winds from the S and steering E St. Lawrence Island 8 miles off in sight Latter part wind S W at 7 A.M. Barbed a Native of the NW end of the Island

While On Her Northward Cruise

June 1868
592 Monday 15th Corn with light and from N. St. Lawrence near by employed in sailing north the Bk. Endicott & Concordia & Helen Snow Mian's part calms Latter part light wind from S sailing with the Concordia and reaching Bone the ship under all sail steering in for Indian Point through the Ice at 9 A.M. spoke the Concordia clear at 10 A.M. spoke the Milo clear 31 ships in sight

593 Tuesday 16th Corn with fine wind from the S off Indian at 4 P.M. luffed too & spoke the Bk. Niagara of Indian Point 3 whaled at 7 P.M. it came in a thick fog broke up the land Mian's and latter part fresh wind from S and thick fog the ship laying at anchor under double reef. Top sailed and Ice no sun

594 Wednesday 17th Corn with fresh wind from the S and thick fog at 4 P.M. the fog began to light at 5 P.M. saw the land the west side of the Strait the South Head of St. Lawrence Bay barney saw some Dec and 7 ships Mian's part light wind from W and steering ESE Latter part light air and calms the ship on the Northward tack plenty of Ice and some ship Lat 64° 30' N Long 170° 22' W

595 Thursday 18th Corn with light wind from the NE the ship on the Northward tack some Bk. in sight Mian's and latter part light wind from the NW to NE the land in sight Lat 65° 03' N Long 170° 55' W

596 Friday 19th Corn with light wind from the E and SE steering NW by N through the Ice the South Head of St. Lawrence Bay barney NW by N 10 miles & plenty Mian's and latter part light wind from S and thick weather the ship on the Eastward tack in the Ice
