

Remarks On Board Ship Corinthian
July 1868

612 Sunday 5th Com with fresh wind from the N.W. at 5 P.M. the fog light up and sail the ship on the North and Easton tack nothing in sight. Miacaw part five miles from the ship at 10 P.M. came up to the Dec and tack the ship to the Westward. Later part five miles from North and clear the ship off and on the Dec at 8 A.M. four 2 boats for Rich racks but found them shy at 10 A.M. four all 5 boats for Malrus 3 ships in sight Lat 67° 09

613 Monday 6th Com with light air all 5 boats 25 Malrus in the Dec a Malrus in at 5 P.M. the 3 boats came on board with 9 Malrus. Miacaw part at 11 P.M. the last boats came on Board with 30 Malrus in all five miles from N.W. and clear. Latter part light wind from the N.W. 3 ships in sight and the land the ship off and on the land Lat 67° 25 N Long 167° 00 W

614 Tuesday 7th Com with fine wind from the N.W. it was pleasant at 3 P.M. spoke the Concoria and heard a gun. Miacaw part at 10 P.M. broke up the gun at 11 P.M. spoke the Cornilus Norland. Miacaw and Latter part light air from the N to S.W. at 9 A.M. went on Board Bk. Concoria after flour

615 Wednesday 8th Com with light wind from the N.W. and N.E. and fog the most of the time 4 ships in sight. Miacaw part the same. Latter part thick fog. N.W. by N along the Dec at 11 A.M. the fog light Lat 68° 13

While On Her Northward Cruise 1868
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616 Thursday 9th Com with light wind from the S and clear at 1 P.M. four all 5 boats for Malrus at 3 P.M. came on Board with 3 Malrus saw 3 ships. Miacaw part saw the ship Three Brothers cutting light wind from S.E. the ship on opposite tack at 3 A.M. it came in a thick fog the ship laying with her main yard aback. Latter part the same thick fog

617 Friday 10th Com with light wind from S.E. and thick fog at 3 P.M. a double reef the top sails strong rollers and fog. Miacaw part fresh wind from the S at 11 P.M. the fog cleared off wore ship to the Eastward saw a plenty of Dec to the North of us 1 ship steering N.W. Latter part light gale from the S and some fog the ship on the Easton tack saw 2 ships Lat 68° 18 N Long 168° 32

618 Saturday 11th Com with light gale from S the ship on the Easton tack steering E by S fog the most of the time. Miacaw and Latter part the weather the same the ship on opposite tack no sun

619 Sunday 12th Com with fresh wind from S and thick fog the ship off and on the Dec under easy sail it was unpleasant. Miacaw part light wind from the E the ship under short sail at 11 P.M. the fog light saw the S and Cape Lisburns bearing N.W. E distant 9 leagues saw 2 ships at 4 A.M. made all sail Latter part light wind from N.E. to E the ship on the Northward tack saw a plenty of Dec in shore saw 4 vessels some rain and fog
