

Remarks Pass On Board Ship Cornithian

656 Tuesday 18 Com with light wind from the E and a fine weather saw a few whales but no channel 8 Ships a Whaling to the northward and the Wheller Snow a cutting saw 16 Ships & the Lanza in sight. Miacas part at 8 P.M. four all 5 Boats for whales but no luck came in fog. Later part fresh wind from E and fog at 11 A.M. the fog cleared

657 Wednesday 19 Com with fresh wind from the E & N ships in sight 2 a Boiling and the most of them a Whaling at 2 P.M. 1 hour 2 Boats at 3 P.M. four 2 more Boats at 4 P.M. the West Boat struck and killed at 8 P.M. took him along side at the Edge of the Ice the Boats took him out of the Ice Miacas part fresh wind from the E at 9 P.M. commenced to cut at 3 A.M. finish cutting at 5 A.M. it came in a thick fog. Later part thick fog the most of the time at 10 A.M. spoke the Wheller Snow & Whales

658 Thursday 20 Com with light wind from the N.E. and clear saw 5 Ships and 1 a whaling and some a Boiling the Lanza in sight. Near Blossams Shoals plenty of Ice Miacas part wind from all points of the compass saw a few Whales later part light air and calms some fog at 5 A.M. four 2 Boats for whales at 8 A.M. four 2 more and at 10 A.M. four the Harbours Boat quite a number of whales in sight but light air fine weather the Lanza near the Shoals 11 miles of and 25 Ships Lat 70° 25'

White On Her Northan Cruised 1868

659 Friday 21 Com with light air from all points of the compass and pleasant 35 Ships in sight 1 of them a Boiling a quite a number of whales all of the Boats row after whales but no wind and impossible to fasten Miacas part the same at 9 P.M. the Boats all came on Board and give it up for the night and reported plenty of whales the Ship George Howland took a whale at 8 A.M. four all 5 Boats for whales it still light air and calms and whales going quick Lat 70° 32' Long 160° 54'

660 Saturday 22 Com with calms at 2 P.M. the Boats came on Board the Ship near the Lanza North of Blossams Shoals 2 Ships a Boiling at 3 P.M. light wind from N.W. Miacas part light air and calms later part light air from all points of the compass and thick fog the most of the time the Ship working to the S.W. at 6 A.M. started the Crynourks saw 3 whales and 5 Ships and a boiling the Ship in 12 fathoms of water near the Lanza

661 Sunday 23 Com with light air from all points of the compass and thick fog the Ship working to the S.W. Miacas part the same the Ship George Howland coming some fog the Ship off and on the Ice the Boiling saw 1 whale

662 Monday 24 Com with light wind from N.E. to E saw a few whales and a number of Ships a whaling saw 1 take a whale 5 Ships a Boiling the Lanza in sight Miacas part light wind from E at 9 P.M. after dark four 2 Boats for whales the Lanza Boat
