1 Mo 1870

73 Friday 14th Com. with light rain from the N steering S by E by compass under all sail. Midday and latter part fine. Broke out rain and pleasant weather rain at water and N. N. steering S and S by W and none nothing in sight that looked like a whale the Bk. in sight watch employed in breaking out water. Lat 47° 05' Long 63° 30'

74 Saturday 15th Com. with fine pleasant weather. Sailing wind N. N. steering S by W and S by N the topsail and Bk. in sight steering S by E. Midday and latter part light rain from N. N. steering S. S. W and South. Latter part light rain from the N steering S. S. W at 11 A. M. the wind shifted to the S. W. Lat 49° 06' S Long 65° 10' W

75 Sunday 16th Com. with fresh rain from the N and working to the land S at 1 P. M. took ship to the South and Westward pleasant weather. Midday part light rain from N. E. to N. N. steering S by E and South pleasant weather. Latter part fine weather rain from N. N. to N. S. W at 8 A. M. steering S. E. by compass for the Straits. Lat 51° 30' Long 66° 11' W

76 Monday 17th Com. with pleasant weather the rain from N to S steering S. S. E. the rain continued in puffs. Midday part fresh rain from the N. N. steering S. S. E. by compass. Latter part fresh rain from N. N. W with fresh squalls steering S. E. by compass at 11 A. M. no operation some and hauled to the N. S. W. Lat 53° 09' S Long 64° 56' W

77 Tuesday 18th Com. with fresh rain from the S. N. steering S. E. at 2 P. M. braced up the main the land across the ship by the rain on the South to the west and Easton tack at 3 P. M. rain the land ward of the baring S. E. by S by compass light air and fresh of calm and a heavy swell. Midday part S. Mair light rain from the N. W. and steering S. by E. some rain. Latter part fresh rain from N. W. Pass through Mair rain at 7 A. M. entered the Strait the Straits of S. Mair at 9 A. M. got through the Straits steering S by N some rain squalls. no sun

78 Wednesday 19th Com. with fresh rain from N. N. steering S by N at 3 P. M. the rain shifted to the South in a squall shortened sail the ship on the Easton tack. Midday part at 6 P. M. the rain from S. E. and N. E. the ship under all sail some rain steering S by compass at 4 A. M. the rain shifted to the N. saw the Island of Cape Horn bearing N by N the ship on the Southern tack. Latter part fresh rain and rain the ship under close reef top sails. no sun

79 Thursday 20th Com. with fresh rain from N. with squalls of rain the ship on the Southern tack under close reef. Top sails none sail in sight on the Southern tack. Midday part fresh rain from the N. with fresh squalls the ship on the Southern tack. Latter part the same none Bk. in sight bound West. Lat 57° 32' S Long 66° 33' W
