

Remarks Pass On Board Bk. No. 8

2 Nov 1870

109 Saturday 19th Nov. with fresh winds the cooper from the N. N. and some rain the ship on no better the Maston back at 5 P.M. the winds shifted to the S.W. in a rain squall saw 1 Bk. Miaco the cooper part light air and calms at 11 P.M. repairs the cooper broke his last poor P.M. Man his suffering is over in this room he died in great misery untill about 15 Mins before his death Latter part light winds from the S.W. steering N. N. W. heavy rain from the S.W. for N. S. W. more ship in sight the watch employ in taking out for stops for the New Mexico ship at St. Carlos Lat 34° 20' Long 76° 06'

110 Sunday 20th Nov. with light air from Burice the steering N. N. W. fine weather the cooper a heavy swell from N. S. W. at 5 P.M. call all hands and committed the cooper to the deep Miaco part light air from the N. N. W. calms Latter part light wind from the N. the ship on the Northern tack under all sail Lat 36° 11' S Long 76° 24' W

111 Monday 21st Nov. with light winds from the N. N. W. the ship on the Northern and Eastern tack pleasant weather Miaco part light winds and rain in squalls the repairs ship on father tack Latter part light wind from S. W. the ship on the Northern tack at 9 A.M. wind steering N. by N. at 10 A.M. passed a English Barque steering E. by compass the watch employed in repairing the Main sail Lat 34° 45' S Long 76° 54' W

112 Tuesday 22nd Nov. with light winds from the S. E. steering N. N. W. some rain squalls the watch employed in repairing the sail Miaco and Latter part fresh winds from the S. E. and steering N. N. W. at 5 P.M. saw some of the Islands of the Antilles being by compass N. by E distant 10 leagues at 9 A.M. sent in 3 Boats a fishing none Bk. in sight so ended 3 boats a fishing

113 Wednesday 23rd Nov. with light winds lost from the ship at 6 P.M. 2 boats came of none Man with about 4 Hls of fish the Larboora by inserted Boat came of from those with the former and got and none Man from the Islands and the 5 Hls of loss of none of his Boats crew by the fish Name of Enos who deserted sold the former put out none slow Boat Miaco and Latter part a fresh Bow light wind from the steering N. by N. at 8 A.M. Boat put out a new Bow Boat Lat 32° 33' S Long 78° 32' W

114 Thursday 24th Nov. with light winds from the N. steering N. by N. by compass the watch employed in various Bds. Miaco and Latter part light wind from N. and N. S. steering N. by N. Lat 30° 32' S Long 78° 14' W

115 Friday 25th Nov. with light winds from the N. S. W. steering N. by N. at 4 P.M. some rain squalls wind from S. E. Miaco and Latter part fine winds from the S. E. by steering N. by N. the watch employed in various Bds Lat 27° 33' S Long 78° 12' W
