5 Nov 1870

190 Monday 9th Nov. with fresh wind from the E. N. E steering N. N. W by N under all sail a thick over cast of clouds Cobbin Stone Miacaw and Latter part light Gale from E steering N. N. W by N the watch 2 Bullock employed in breaking out for Boots Boggs shoes and Killing Bullock and Fred putting up the Cobbin Stone Lat 48.36

191 Tuesday 10th Nov. with fresh Gale from S. E by E the watch employed in Killing Hogg the ship under all sail steering N. N. W by N 1/2 N Miacaw put the sails Latter part fresh Gale from Gale 8 the S. E and rain steering N. N. W by N rain thick rainy weather. no sun

192 Wednesday 11th Nov. with fresh Gale. fresh Gale from the S. S. E and rain steering N. W and rain 1/2 N under a whole Main top sail and fore sail close reef for top sail thick weather Miacaw part wind S. N steering N. N. thick rainy weather Latter part light Gale from S. N steering N. by N with cloudy weather some rain squalls the ship under all sail no sun
