

Remarks Pass On Board Bk. T. Dickason

5 Mo 1890

197 Monday 16th Com. with light wind from the N the Bk. on the Eastern tack under all sail some passing foggy squalls Miacaw and latter part light air and calm and snow the watch employed in various jobs to see nothing Lat 58° 11' N Long 172° 41' W

198 Tuesday 17th Com. with light air and snow calm from N E the ship on the N Western tack some snow Miacaw part light rain from N E and N the Bk. by the wind on opposite tacks with thick foggy and snow the ship under all sail no sun

199 Wednesday 18th Com. with light wind and set up the foggy the ship on the Eastern tack under all sail a swell from the S N Miacaw and latter part light wind from the S and N N the ship on the North and Eastern tack some snow and a thick over cast of clouds employed in dealing out flops no sun

200 Thursday 19th Com. with light wind from put up the N N the Bk. on the North and Eastern tack under all sail a thick over cast of clouds no sun Miacaw and latter part light air from N N the Bk. on the North and Eastern tack under all sail some light snow squalls Lat 60° 39' N Long 176° 50' E

201 Friday 20th Com. with light air from putting round the N and S N steering N E by N by N theatring by compass the cooper employed in putting repaired the theatring in the Mast Miacaw fore top and latter part light air from S. S. E to E steering N E by N Lat 60° 59' N

202 Saturday 21st Com. with light wind from N E the Bk. by the wind on the North and Eastern tack cloudy over cast Miacaw and latter part fresh wind from N E and foggy and snow at 7 P M rain the Dec on the West shore at 9 P M tack ship to the Eastward at 10 A M it cleared up Lat 61° 30' N

203 Sunday 22nd Com. with fresh wind from N E saw 6 ships the ship of and on the Dec saw 6 ships to the N E some snow a heavy swell from the S E Miacaw and latter part light rain from N E and snow storm the Bk. off and on the Dec under easy sail it very cold weather no sun

204 Monday 23rd Com. with light gales from N E and E N E thick snow storm the Bk. off and on the Dec under easy sail Miacaw and latter part fresh gales from the N E and E N E and a thick snow storm the ship under short sail on opposite tack no sun

205 Tuesday 24th Com. with fresh gales from N E and E N E a thick snow storm the most off the time the Bk. under 2 close reef top sail on different tack Miacaw and latter part light wind from N E at 8 A M spoke the ship Josephine of N. B. 2 Whales the Fleet having taken 1 and 2 Whales

206 Wednesday 25th Com. with fresh wind from N E the ship on the Eastern tack by the Dec Miacaw and latter part the same fine weather Lat 61° 16' N Long 177° 40' E
