ship block N. N. E. and fog the ship still enclosed
in the ice in the ice all sail furled Mianac and
every thing latter part fresh wind from N. and fog

furled the ice fast away

225 Sunday 12th Com. with fresh wind from
ship in the ice the N. N. W. by compass thick fog the most
in the ice of the time Mianac and latter part

226 Monday 13th Com. with light wind
from N. N. W. thick fog Mianac part
calm and light wind from E. by compass
bearing with the ship Europe and E. and
latter part wind S. W. thick fog ship
in the ice no sails set fog

227 Tuesday 14th Com. with light wind
from S. and a heavy swell from S.
bearing and a thick fog at 3 P. M. sound found
water the bottom in 80 fathoms of water Mianac and
ship latter part fresh wind from the S. S. W.
Europe at 9 P. M. thick fog the ship came
into scattering ice a heavy swell
from the S. E. and South the ship
Europe in sight thick fog the ship
under short sail
