July 1870

246 Sunday 3rd Com. with fresh Gale
from N.W. and a thick dense fog
the ship standing on 4 hours tack
Miaaco and latter part the same at 11
A.M. the fog light up Lat 64° 44' N
Long 171° 10' W

247 Monday 4th Com. with fresh rain from
the S.W. the ship on the Weston tack
thick fog over the land and some ice Miaaco part
light wind from S.E. steering N by E and
at 10 some ice 3 ships of the South head
of St. Lawrence Bay latter part light rain
clear from S.E. and fine clear weather steering
weather N.E. by N along the Ice by St. Lawrence Bay
saw 2 Bks going the Bay to Aukon Lat 65° 25'

248 Tuesday 5th Com. with light rain from
clear the S.E. steering N.E. by N for the Amicaas
Island some ice Miaaco part light
wind from the S.E. steering N.W. and
N.N.W. at 5 A.M. passed the North End
of Cape East latter part fine weather
the wind the same steering N.W. and
N.N.W. saw a number of thick walrus
in plenty of ice Lat 66° 45' N

249 Wednesday 6th Com. with light rain from
spoke the the S.E. steering N.W. through the ice
saw a number of ships a Walrus in
saw a plenty of Walrus and Rip back
Miaaco and latter part light wind from
the N.N.W. steering N.W. by N spoke the Bk.
Seneca of N.B. and Mary of Edgartown and
head a gun steering E.N.E. Lat 67° 55' N
Long 168° 40' W

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250 Thursday 7th Com. with light rain from
the N steering N.E. at 5 P.M. spoke the
Bk. Eugenia N. Neaford reports nothing
over plus the East Shore Braseg up on
the South and Weston tack Miaaco part
at 4 A.M. came up to the Ice on the Weston
Mollnathore latter part the wind light from the
N the ship along the Ice at 8 A.M. lower 5
Boats for Walrus at 11 A.M. 3 boats
came on Board with 2 Walrus Lat 67° 15'

251 Friday 8th Com. with light rain from
4 Mollnathore N.W. 2 boats in the ice at 4 P.M. came
on Board with 4 Walrus at 6 P.M. spoke
the Crucorain and head a gun Miaaco
part strong wind from S.E. the ship
working to the South latter part fresh
wind from S.E. the ship on the N.W. tack
some rain and cloudy weather at 10
pass 11 A.M. lower 4 boats for Walrus
saw the land near Cape Surge Lat 67° 05' N

252 Saturday 9th Com. with light rain from
the N.E. and thick weather at 3 P.M.
the Boats came on Board with 6 Walrus
at 5 P.M. lower 5 Boats for Walrus
at 8 P.M. came on Board Miaaco and
the Crucorain latter part fog and rain the ship under
easy sail around the ice

253 Sunday 10th Com. with light rain
and thick weather the ship under
easy sail Miaaco and latter part
the same fog and rain
