

Remarks On Board Dk. Chas
Sept 1870

317 Sunday 11th Nov. with fresh gales from
Ealed NE steering SE saw 2 Whales and 2 Ships
a cutting Miaau and latter part
fresh gales from NE at 10 A M steering
Boiling the N by S along the land saw a few
Ships the land about 5 Miles off the
Sea Horse Island in sight

318 Monday 12th Nov. with fresh winds
from the NE the ship steering N by
S along the land at 4 P M saw a Whale
Boiling but never see him but rose at 4 P M.
Took in sail the ship on the Northern tack
Miaau and latter part fresh gales
from E the ship on opposite tack all
hands employed in stowing away Oil
in the Main Hatch Lat 40.57 N

319 Tuesday 13th Nov. with fresh gales
from E the ship on different tack at
Boiling 5 P M finish stowing away Oil some
spoke the snow squalls Miaau and latter
Concordia part fresh winds from NE at 9 A M
4 Whales low all 5 boats for a Whale but
Toke & did not see him again at 10 A M spoke
E Morgan the Bk Concordia 4 Whales Lat 40.42
3 Whales

320 Wednesday 14th Nov. with fresh winds
Boiling from the NE saw a few Ships & Whaling
Toke the Miaau part light winds from the NE
Miaau the ship working to the NE latter
3 Whales part light winds from N. N. E and a
few of snow squalls at 9 A M spoke
the ship Maniggo N. B. 3 Whales saw a
number of Ships Lat 40.49 N

321 Thursday 15th Nov. with light winds from
Boiling E with snow squalls saw a few Whales
3 Ships a Whaling the ship on the Northern
at 2 A M tack Miaau and latter part light
winds from the SE and E the ship on
Boiling the NE tack at 9 A M spoke the Concordia
and had a few snow squalls

322 Friday 16th Nov. with light winds from
the SE the ship on the Southern tack
at 1 P M spoke the Bk Roman of N. B.
8 Whales Miaau and latter part fresh
winds from the W & N the ship on the
South and Western tack Lat 40.50 N
Long 160.00 W

323 Saturday 17th Nov. with light gales from
W the ship on the different tack & moving
to the Westward Miaau part fresh
winds from W & N and W the ship
working to the Westward latter part
light winds from W & N and a heavy
well Lat 40.34 N
Long 160.30 W

324 Sunday 18th Nov. with fresh winds
from the W and snow squalls at
2 P M carried away the Port and Star
Dk. Martingale the ship working to
the Westward Miaau and latter
part light winds from N. N. E steering N W
Concordia by W at 9 A M gave with the Bk
Concordia N. B. Lat 40.55 N

325 Monday 19th Nov. with light winds
from the NE steering N W Miaau
and latter part the same a cloud over
cast 3 Ships in sight no snow
