

Remarks Pass On Board Bk. G. Aickson

333 Tuesday 27th Com. with light winds from E at 4 P.M. finish cutting some Whales and took the other along side at 6 P.M. commence to cut at 9 P.M. finish and take out the watch. Micae part fine weather and light winds. Latter part fresh winds from N.E. some snow squalls at 8 A.M. lower 3 Boats for Whales the Carboara Boat struck zone at 11 A.M. took him along side the Island in sight sailing N by N distant 15 Miles

334 Wednesday 28th Com. with fresh winds from N.E. and a heavy swell from E at 2 P.M. commence to cut at 4 P.M. finish and set the watch. Micae and Latter part light winds from the E. saw 8 Ships and allow Whaling at 8 A.M. lower 3 Boats for Whales at 10 M. came on Board no luck at 11 A.M. lower again the Bow Boat struck at 11 A.M. started the Engine and the Island sailing N by E distant 25 Miles

335 Thursday 29th Com. with light winds from the S at 3 P.M. took the Whale along side at 5 P.M. commence to cut at 9 P.M. finish and set the watch. Micae and Latter part light winds from the S the Ship working to the point ward saw quite a number of Whales but small ones at 11 A.M. lower the Starboard Boat struck and killed him the Island in sight sailing N by E distant 30 Miles

336 Friday 30th Com. with light winds from S at 3 P.M. took the Whale along side at 3 P.M. commence to cut at 5 P.M. finish at 6 P.M. winds W.N.W. Micae part light winds from N.W. Latter part light winds from N steering S.W. by S a thick vapor on the Water the Island sailing S.W. by S distant 20 Miles

337 Saturday 31st Com. with light winds from the N.E. starting most all points of the compass saw 4 Ships to a Whaling Micae and Latter part light winds from S.E. the Ship on the North and Easton tack at 6 A.M. spoke the Bk. Aurora N.B. full in want of Casks to put her Oil in at 9 A.M. came up to the Dec. saw a plenty of small Whales the Carboara Boat took shore along side

338 Sunday 1st Com. with fresh winds from S.E. at 3 P.M. commence to cut sent 2 Boats in + taken to the Dec. at 6 P.M. finish cutting and let the Boat Aurora have 1564 gallons of casks the Ship Dec. mused all sail heaving to the S.E. to clear the way of Dec. the Roman & Aurora in company Micae killed part on short tacks the Dec. on both tacks Latter part moderate some with a heavy swell from S.E. at 10 A.M. stopped Boiling and set the main sail all hands employed in stowing coals saw a number of Whales

339 Monday 2nd Com. with fresh winds and a commence swell from S.E. the Ship working out of Boiling the Dec. Herald Island E. and sailing S by W at 6 P.M. took ship to the N.E. the Island distant 20 Miles Micae and Latter the same
