340 Tuesday 4th Com. with fresh wind from Boiling the E N E and N E the Ship on opposite tack at 3 P M lower 3 Boats for Mates but did not chase them long Miala and latter part fresh Gales from N E the Ship on the Eastern tack Boiling Lat 40.47

341 Wednesday 5th Com. with fresh Gales from N. N. E the Ship on the Eastern tack at 5 P M cooled down it blowing to heavy to Boil Miala and latter part very heavy Gales from the N. N. E by compass the Ship laying too under low Main top sail Main Spruce Fore and Fore top Mast Stay sail laying very well it very cold

342 Thursday 6th Com. with heavy gales the Ship laboring quite hard it blowing almost a Hurricane in squalls Miala part the same lost the Starboard Bow Boat the Ship laying to well but cooling down side on the Eastern tack Moderated some

343 Friday 7th Com. with fresh gales from N. N. E at 2 P M called all hands to make sail made all reasonable sail points N N W the Ship on the Eastern tack Miala part heavy gales from N N W came across in a snow squall at 3 A M call all hands to take in sail split the Main sail latter part heavy Gales with very heavy squalls the Blubber shifted Lat 67.30 N Long 168.10 E

344 Saturday 8th Com. with very heavy Gales from the N N with squalls of snow the Ship on the Eastern tack under low Main top sail Main spruce Fore & Fore top Mast Stay sail Miala and latter part the same

345 Sunday 9th Com. with very heavy gales from N N with snow the Ship on the E tack in 20 fathoms of water Miala part moderated some 16 fathoms of water latter part at 8 A M made some sail and steered S E for the Straits the Eastern passage at 10 A M Ship in 15 fathoms of water lost the Mast Boat a heavy swell and ball increasing saw 1 Ship lost 20 Bbls of Oil

Monday 10th Com. with fresh Gales from N N a very heavy sea steering S E some snow at 6 P M raised the small diomide Island distant 1 Miala and thank God for the sight of it thick snow storm Miala part at 2 A M luffed too latter part fresh gales from N at 6 A M steering S N by S saw the land the Mt side of the Straits

346 Tuesday 11th Com. with fresh gales from the N and a thick snow storm steering S by compass at 6 P M found by the lead the Ship out side of the Straits in 35 fathoms of water Miala part light Gales from N E steering S N latter part the same at 8 A M took in all sail but low Main top sail and Fore Stay sail and commenced to Boil and stow down Oil the Ship laying to on the Eastern tack some snow squalls
