 mid & Egg steering N by N Middle part the same
 Spits of Latter part wind from N and S N steering
 Snow N by N at 8 A.M. the Egg let up Lat 49° 34' N
 Long 169° 10' E

550 Saturday 6th Com. with fresh winds from S N
 steering N by N some spits of snow Midaco &
 Snow Latter part light gales from the S N at 10 A.M.
 storm came in a snow storm no ice

551 Sunday 7th Com. with fresh Gales from the
 S. E. the ship on the Western tack under 2 close
 Gales & reefed top sail a thick snow storm the most of the
 snow time Middle part light Gales from S N & S N
 plenty the ship under close reef top sail on different tacks
 of Sails Latter part fresh winds from the S N and W
 at daylight made all sail steering N. E. some
 passing snow squalls Lat 53° 48' N
 Long 170° 04' E

552 Monday 8th Com. with light gales from N W
 snow the ship on the North & Eastern tack it surviving
 the most of the time Midaco and Latter part
 Wound light Gales from the N W the ship on the North &
 Deck the Eastern tack a thick snow storm the most of the time

553 Tuesday 9th Com. with moderate Gales with
 snow snow from N W & N. N. W. cloudy weather
 Midaco part wind N the ship on the Northern tack
 Latter part fresh winds from S N steering N plenty
 of snow squalls at 11 A.M. light Gales & snow Lat 56° 08' N
 Long 134° 13' E

554 Wednesday 10th Com. with fresh winds from N. N. W.
 snow snow the weather very changeable Midaco part fine
 Bunt & wind from S N steering N Latter part wind N N W and
 fine hail snow at 4 A.M. wind S. N. W cleared fresh breeze
 Lat 57° 43' N Long 175° 29' E

 fine breeze from the N and very cold the ship on the Eastern tack
 killed the clear weather Lat 58° 28' N

555 Friday 12th Com. with light winds from the N the ship
 on the Western tack clear cold weather Midaco
 & Latter part light wind from the N. N. E & E. N. E
 the ship on the Northern tack at 2 A.M. passed some
 small Ice Bumps at 9 A.M. raised the Ice and too
 12 ships at 12 o'clock tacked off from the Ice

556 Saturday 13th Com. with light winds from the E. N. E &
 N E the ship working to the Eastern along the Ice
 Midaco & Latter part fresh breeze from the E. N. E the
 ship off and on the Ice 4 ships Lat 59° 55' N
 Long 178° 07' E

557 Sunday 14th Com. with light Gales from E. N. E & N E
 the ship off and on the Ice at 4 P.M. came in a
 snow storm at 5 P.M. spoke the Bark Massachusetts of
 New Bedford Midaco & Latter part fresh Gales
 from N E some snow and Ice Lat 60° 09' N
 Long 176° 51' E

558 Monday 15th Com. with fresh Gales from N E and
 Gales clear the ship under storm sails saw the Ice
 Bump Midaco & Latter part light Gales from N. N. E
 came in at 8 A.M. spoke the Bk. Massachusetts and head a
 Massachusetts saw 1 other Bk Lat 59° 57' N
 Long 176° 39' E

559 Tuesday 16th Com. with fresh Gales from the North
 light Gales the Bk on different tacks working to the North pass
 the Bk. Logora of New Bedford Midaco & Latter part
 the same some snow saw 3 ships and the Ice at 11 A.M.
 more ship of from the Ice a thick snow storm
 the most of the time Lat 60° 01' N
