 642 Sunday 6th Com. with fresh wind from N and a
 light breeze from NE the ship running the Dee South
 of the Narrows at 5 P.M. hauled to the NE by the voice
 of the crew. Mianco and latter part fresh wind from N and some
 foggy the ship on the North & Eastern tack Lat 68° 53' N
 Long 173° 33' W
- 643 Monday 7th Com. with light wind from N & W
 the ship on the Eastern tack under all sail fine weather
 Receiving the sun & moon Mianco & latter part light Easting wind
 which brought a pleasant weather the ship on the North & Eastern tack
 under all sail Lat 69° 40' N
 Long 173° 40' W
- 644 Tuesday 8th Com. with fine wind from E at 1 P.M. started
 the vessel at 2 P.M. took a ship off from the Dee plus
 weather Mianco and latter part fresh wind from E & N and
 Boiling clear, working to the Eastward along the Dee a
 Boiling nothing in sight Lat 69° 32' N
 Long 171° 05' W
- 645 Wednesday 9th Com. with fresh wind from E & NE
 Boiling the ship working to the East along the Dee clear
 at 8 P.M. weather Mianco and latter part fresh wind from
 which Boiling the ship steering to the Eastward along the
 Dee at 6 A.M. took in sail and commenced Steaming
 through the Narrows in the main hatch Lat 69° 10' N
 Long 169° 37' W
- 646 Thursday 10th Com. with light Easting from N & E
 At anchor at 2 P.M. made some sail at 5 P.M.
 which steering Oil Mianco and latter part
 light from NE the ship working NE some fog Lat 69° 15' N
 Long 169° 39' W
- 647 Friday 11th Com. with light Easting from N & E at 1 P.M.
 the ship working to the NE some fog in smaller Mianco
 which part the same latter part fresh wind from N & W and
 clear the ship on the North and Eastern tack saw 3
 Charles ship and a few pieces of Ice Lat 69° 17' N
 Long 166° 17' W

 saw large and too casks of Bread Mianco part calico saw 2 Bk. Orice
 which latter part light wind from E and some fog the ship
 Mianco working to the NE saw a plenty of Mianco Lat 70° 11' N
 Long 162° 53' W
- 150 Monday 14th Com. with fine wind from N the ship working
 on the Narrows at 1 P.M. saw the land 6 ships the Dee about 30 miles
 1 ship to the South from the Mianco and latter part the Mianco the sun
 6 ships in sight and thick fog the ship lying aback
- Tuesday 15th Com. with light wind from N and a clear
 weather at 1 P.M. spoke E. Morgan and got a B. Load of wood
 which the ship working to the North along the Narrows
 got from Mianco and latter part the Mianco at 8 A.M.
 spoke the Bk. Arwashank and got 10 tons Lat 70° 28' N
- 652 Wednesday 16th Com. with light wind from N at 4
 and 30 ships at 1 P.M. passed Blossom Shoal. Under full light wind
 came to Mianco weather latter part light wind from N & W and
 which 4 ships at 8 A.M. spoke Bk. Englewood and got 10 tons
 at 11 A.M. thick fog came to anchor in 9 fathoms water
 among the scattering Ice no sun
- 153 Thursday 17th Com. with light wind from N & W the ship to
 the ship which fog and rain the Dee going North about 2 miles
 per hour passed the ship Mianco and latter part
 which light wind and calico the Dee passing the same per
 8 fathoms getting up against the ship after which fog
