Commences with light air from Eastward with rain at 7 AM light winds NW clear weather all ship crew empty breaking out after dark Let first strong winds W. NW clear Sea ends

Saturday April 4th

Comes in with a light air from the NW pleasant hands on board ship empty. Stowing down Schooner Atlas went out this morning for the windward after ballast Day Ends with pleasant weather

Sunday April 5th

Begins with a light breeze from the NW pleasant hands Employed in various jobs. Loosed sails to dry in the afternoon yanked them put them below latter part light air and pleasant

Monday April 6th

Commences with a fresh breeze from the NW pleasant hands Employed fitting boats and other jobs Day Ends pleasant

Tuesday April 7th

Comes in with a light breeze from the NW cloudy and rainy afternoon Calm. Clears up pleasant Employed in various jobs Day Ends with pleasant weather

Wednesday April 8th

Comes in with a light air from the NW cloudy weather Cooper Employed setting up sheets for water Day Ends with thick rainy weather

Thursday April 9th

Comes in with a light breeze from the NW pleasant hands on board Employed in various jobs Cooper setting up sheets Day Ends pleasant Schooner Atlas arrived in ballast

Friday April 10th

Comes in with a light air from the NW pleasant hands Employed in various jobs fittings boats & P Day Ends with a light air from NW

Saturday April 11th

Commences with a fresh breeze from the NW with thick rainy weather hands on board Employed fitting boats and other jobs Schooner & S. Sawyer went out this morning bound for three island harbor to render assistance to Capt. Spruce of the ship Danae Hicks whose schooner ran ashore on the Lee Coast and got her. Redder Day Ends with the wind at W. Clear weather

Sunday April 12th

Comes in with a smart breeze from the NW by NW pleasant weather hands Employed in various jobs repairing sails taking sails ashore Day Ends with a fresh breeze from the NW
