

3 Ship Corinthian of New London Tying at Port Harbor Desolation F.D. Rogers Mas.

Sunday April 26th 18
This day commences with fresh breezes from North and steady rain fog &c

Middle part the same
latter part more moderate so on

Monday April 27th

All this day moderate breezes from North and N.W. with steady rain and fog employed on board the ship picking oysters the men remains sick

Tuesday April 28th
This day comes in fresh breezes from N.W. at work on the ship and schooner so on

Wednesday April 29th
Comes in fresh breezes from West the schooner hauls along side middle part the wind N.W. at work on the ship and schooner at dark haul off to anchor

Thursday April 30th
Friday April 30th
Begins fresh breezes from North with rain Middle part more pleasant from N.W. at work on sundry jobs
ends fresh breezes the men remains sick

Friday May 1st
Begins fresh breezes from West N. West and equally Middle part the same at work on ships duty ends more moderate

Saturday May 2nd
This day begins with the wind from N. West and rain Middle part cloudy employed on sundry jobs ends light huffling rain and pleasant
the sick man gaining slowly

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Sunday May 3rd 1867
This day begins with fresh breezes from East with steady rain Middle and latter part the same with thick fog so ends

Monday May 4th
Commences light winds from the Westward and pleasant weather the lifts and sawyer got under weigh employed boiling Middle part rain squalls ends pleasant

Tuesday May 5th
Begins light breezes from S.W. the Pacific Capt. Sparr comes in to anchor at west side ends the same the men still sick

Wednesday May 6th
All this day a fresh gale from west with snow squalls

Thursday May 7th
This day comes in light winds from S.W. at 5 am the Pacific got under weigh and stood up the bay employed boiling setting up shoals &c

Friday May 8th
All this day calm and pleasant filling water on shore setting up shoals and other jobs

Saturday May 9th
This day begins with fresh breezes from N.W. and equally at work setting up shoals and general ships duty
