

64 Ship Corinthian of New London Tying at Port Harbour Resolation & D Rogers Mas

Sunday May 10th 1837
This day begins with light breezes from West and pleasant weather Middle part the wind fresh from NW and cloudy ends light variable winds at 6 PM the latter come in with two humpbacks hauled along side & cut blubber

Monday May 11th
All this day moderate breezes from North with steady rain the latter along side the Pacific Capt Ward come in at dark the latter hauled off to anchor

Tuesday May 12th
Comes in pleasant from West the schooner latter and Pacific get under weigh at 2 PM the latter come in to anchor at work boiling

Wednesday May 13th
Begins moderate breezes from NW at daylight the latter get under weigh employed in boiling

Thursday May 14th
Begins with fresh breezes from NW with snow squalls at work boiling Middle and latter part light winds and pleasant weather the schooner up the bay

Friday May 15th
Comes in light winds from NW employed in setting up shooks and other ships duty at 4 PM the latter come in hauled along side the bark pitching out blubber ends pleasant

Saturday May 16th
Begins fresh breezes from SE with snow squalls Middle part clear the wind hauled round to West and NW so ends

65 Sunday May 17th 1837
This day commences with light winds from West at 4 AM the latter get under weigh setting up shooks at work on ships duty Middle part the wind SW with thick snow ends the same

Monday May 18th
All this day light air from South West both ships boiling the schooner up the bay

Tuesday May 19th
Begins fresh breezes from NW with snow squalls at work boiling at 4 PM the Pacific Capt Ward come in at sundown get through boiling ends light winds and pleasant

Wednesday May 20th
Comes in fresh breezes from NW hauled to North and NW with rain and snow ends from NW

Thursday May 21st
This day comes in fresh breezes from NW with snow squalls the Pacific went out and returned to anchor ends more moderate from NW

Friday May 22nd
Begins moderate breezes from NW the Pacific get under weigh at work setting up shooks and sundry jobs ends thick fog the schooner up the bay

Saturday May 23rd
This day comes in moderate breezes from NW at 1 PM the latter come in with 4 humpbacks hauled along side hauled out the blubber so ends
