Sunday June 28th

All this day a strong gale from S.W. with snow squalls employed in hauling the sawyer and Atlas in the harbour

Monday June 29th

This day begins with moderate breezes from N.W. the Atlas and Sawyer got under weigh at work hauling Middle part fresh breezes with rain and fog the Sawyer came in to anchor ends light winds from North

Tuesday June 30th

This day serious winds and weather from the Westward toward the Sawyer went to seaward employed in hauling so ends at 9 AM the Pacific came in

Wednesday July 1st

All this day a fresh gale from North with steady rain ends more moderate

Thursday July 2nd

Came in moderate from S.W. with snow squalls the Pacific got under weigh for fresh bay employed in hauling ends with a heavy gale from S.W.

Friday July 3rd

Begins light air from S.W. and pleasant employed in hauling at 4 PM got through hauling ends moderate from N.W. the Atlas up the bay

Saturday July 4th

The Pacific brought in a libeled by breaking out the fore hole and other ships duty wind from N.W. at 12 PM the Pacific came in the Atlas up the bay

Sunday July 5th

Begins fresh breezes from W.S.W. the Pacific got under weigh and stood down the coast at work on ships duty so ends

Monday July 6th

All this day light huffling air and calm with steady snow at work on Sunday job

Tuesday July 7th

Came in light huffling winds and pleasant at work repairing the byworks getting off water so ends the wind at North

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Wednesday July 8th

This day commences with the wind from North with rain Middle part pleasant employed in cleaning ship ends the same the Atlas up the bay

Thursday July 9th

This day begins with fresh breezes from the Westward with snow squalls at work on ships duty

Friday July 10th

Begins fresh breezes from West at work on ships duty most repaired at 11 AM the Atlas came in with three humpbacks hauld along side the lot and discharged her blubber so ends

Saturday July 11th

All this day a fresh gale from the Westward employed in steaming down block off the lower hole so ends

Sunday July 12th

Begins fresh breezes from the Westward at work on ships duty the Atlas in the harbour repairing her windlass

Monday July 13th

Came in fresh breezes from W.S.W. with snow squalls the Atlas got under weigh for fresh bay at work on ships duty the Pacific came in with main beam gone

Tuesday July 14th

Came in strong breezes from N.W. with snow and rain squalls the Pacific getting a spar from the Atlas up the bay and Sawyer down the coast ends with a fresh gale from N.W. with heavy squalls

Wednesday July 15th

Begins fresh breezes from N.W. the Pacific went out and returned to anchor again at work on ships duty

Thursday July 16th

Came in light winds from S.W. with snow the Pacific went out at work on ships duty latter part from North to West with rain and fog the Atlas up the bay
