Begin fresh breezes from N.West the Atlas get under weigh for Irish Bay employed on ships duty most requested end strong breeze from N.W. with rain

Friday August 7th

Comes in fresh breezes from N.W. employed on various jobs on board the ship the Atlas up the bay at 2 PM the Sawyer comes from the lee coast

Saturday August 8th

Comes in moderate breezes from N.W. employed on various jobs at 1 PM the Atlas come in ends moderate

Sunday August 9th

Comes in fresh breezes from N.W. with steady snow repairing the Atlas main sail

Monday August 10th

Begin light baffling winds from N.W. to S.W. the Atlas and Sawyer went out at 9 PM returned with a whale

Tuesday August 11th

Comes in fresh breezes from N.W. the schooners did go out cutting the whale along side the Sawyer

Wednesday August 12th

This day fresh breezes from N.W. the schooners did not go out at work on various jobs

Thursday August 13th

This day comes in with strong breezes from North with snow and rain at different jobs ends fresh breezes from N.W.

All this day moderate baffling winds from North to South East with steady snow and rain &c ends

Saturday August 15th

Begin this day with fresh breezes from the Westward with snow squalls employed in caulking the cabin deck picking racum and other jobs &c ends

Monday August 17th

Comes in fresh breezes from N.W. with snow squalls at work on ships duty latter part the wind from the Northward

Tuesday August 18th

Begin with fresh breezes from N.W. West the Atlas and Sawyer get under weigh for Irish Bay at work in different jobs middle part the wind hauled to N.W. with rain ends the same

Wednesday August 19th

All this day strong breezes from N.W. with snow squalls on ships duty the schooners up the bay

Thursday August 20th

Comes in strong breezes from N.W. with snow squalls employed in caulking the cabin the schooners up the bay ends moderate from N.W.
