

100 Ship Corinthian Bound to New London Dec 26

Saturday Dec 26th

Commenced with strong gales
w. & w. cloudy weather. Cross
at 8 & at 2 PM shipped a
sea stove salward & Monday sail
started main sail, by the wind
starboard side. Middle part more
moderate made all necessary
sail. Last part English sailing
the night, when it was waited
at 10 PM fresh wind by the
steering, by the wind heading
clear weather. So Ends

Lat by Obs 49° 10' N
Long by Chron 75° 10' E

Sunday Dec 27th

Commenced with fresh winds
of the heading of E by E
middle part fresh breezes
with bad sea on steering
latter part the same ship beating
some

Monday Dec 28th

Comes in with a strong breeze
from the N. E. W. pleasant steering
sp. N. E. under double reef
top sails jib and fore sail
middle part wind hails to
the N. with rain took in all
sail but a close reef. Main
top sail heading N. E. latter
part the same two men sick

Lat 45° 50' Long Dec 29th

Comes in with a gale from
the N. E. W. pleasant sailing
to ship making some weather
middle part more moderate
set fore sail and steered N. E.
latter part set double reef
top sails so Ends this Day

Lat 43° 48'

Long 77° 21'

101 Ship Corinthian towards New London & D Rogers Master 1858

Wednesday Dec 30th

Comes in with a moderate breeze
from the N. E. W. pleasant steering
sp. N. E. hands Employed in Ships
duty. Middle part wind very light
latter part hails to the N. E. with
thick weather. Ends pleasant
Lat 42° 14' Long 76° 43' East

Thursday 31st

Comes in with a light breeze
from the N. E. W. pleasant steering
all sail set middle part the
same latter part wind light
from the N. E. W. pleasant so Ends
sent up main top gallant Mast
crossed the yard and bent the sail
set it

Friday Dec 31st 1858

Comes in with a light moderate
breeze from the N. E. W. pleasant
steering by the wind middle part
fresh breezes double reefed the
top sails latter part moderate Employ
in various jobs so Ends the Day
Lat 39° 37' Long 77° 21'

Saturday Jan 2nd

Comes in with a moderate breeze
from the N. E. W. pleasant steering
by the wind heading N. E. sent
up fore and mizen top gallant
Mast crossed the yards and bent
the sails sent out flying jib
boom and bent fly jib. Saw
two ships steering to the East
ward middle part moderate
latter part light airs from
the N. E. W. with rain steering
sp. N. E. W. all sail set at
Meridian. Clear up

Lat 39° 00' Long 78° 01'

Note while sending up fore top gallant
Mast seizing slipped Mast came down
struck on the walking beam of
the Purchase to the windlass broke
it short off with rendered it useless
