 at 5 P.M. the starboard boat got one black
 fish struck a swordfish and a turtle at work
 on the main top gallant yard broke out for

Thursday November 23rd, 48

These 24 hours fresh breezes from the N E
 course S S W hauled for black fish the
 starboard boat got one at work on the
 main topgallant yard At 11 saw 5 sails
 P.M. 2 sails got a lunar observation by
 measuring the distance of the sun from the
 moon started the trivials at 8 A.M. and
 commenced to trying the two black fish

Friday November 24th 1848

These 24 hours pleasant gails and clear
 weather course from 12 to 6 P.M. S W

hookin sail at 6 P.M. and lay to until one
 At 11 then hauled up the fore course and hove the
 main topsail to the mast and lay until 6 A.M.
 took out the reefs and let fall the fore course.

let the main topgallant sail and kept
 away S W with a backing wind set up the
 main topgallant stays at work on the main
 topgallant yard saw finbacks grampuses
 and three sail

Saturday November 25th, 48

These 24 hours fresh breezes from the N E
 hauled new horses to the new main topgallant
 yard we saw a number of sails coming
 where Lat N Lon W

Sunday November 26th, 48

These 24 hours fresh breezes and clear course
 every where and nowhere

Painted the main top gallant yard and
 washed of the birdwarks rail etc saw a
 spout of a humpback at slight fall lock in sail

Monday November 27th, 48

Fresh breezes and cloudy lookin sail at night
 At 8 A.M. spoke a french Brig from and
 belonging to Rochelle in the west of France
 the captain of he was dressed in white from the
 top of his head to his feet with an extremely
 long whiskers he inquired if we saw her
 France over captain replied in the negative
 he then handed his trumpet to a man by
 his side who cried out. intender ispaniol
 over captain again replied in the
 negative
