

Tuesday January 23rd 1849 concluded
 At 8 o'clock tacked ship again at
 6 o'clock raised the isle of in process. Incessantly
 also at 5 o'clock raised a ship the presumed to be
 the Phoenix of New London

Wednesday January 24th 49

First part strong breezes middle equally last
 part changeable winds

P.M. Tacking up spring yarn cleared out
 the stainer cooler etc at 7 o'clock tacked a cunha
 hairs S.W. distant 25 miles P.M. At 11
 o'clock new fore tack and main sheet at 12 o'clock
 eleven P.M. had a squall a severe one

Thursday January 25th 49

First part fresh breezes middle part scill last
 part small breezes and changeable

P.M. leathered the feet of the main sail making
 scrub broom with Tristand a cunha hairs S.W.
 at 6 o'clock distant 20 miles having gained 5
 miles for the last 24 hours At 8 o'clock some
 white to windward beating towards the island
 firing the main tack and fore sheet caught the first
 prospect

Friday January 26th 49

There is some fresh breezes moderate weather
 however as many ways as there is, with it

P.M. set up the jil stay etc at 7 o'clock raised
 another sail there wind 20 in sight at present
 at 7 o'clock Tristand a cunha hairs South distant
 18 miles At 11 o'clock half past six within 3 miles
 of the island at seven the captain went on
 shore

Friday January 26th 1849 concluded
 When the boat came of with 24 bushels of potatoes
 at seven o'clock the second mate with a boat
 crew went on shore a fishing

Saturday January 27th 49

First part small breezes and clear weather
 Last part Pleasant gale and clear
 P.M. the 3rd mate went on shore directly after
 dinner and came of with 5 bushels of potatoes
 the mate with a boat crew including my self went
 on shore and stayed about an hour we the left
 taking the captain and went on board of the
 Friday afternoon Bedford Capt Wicks and left
 the captain and took the mail of her and brought
 him on board and about 7 o'clock the Phoenix of
 New London ran across the stern and
 the came on board At 7 o'clock went and carried
 the mail of the Florida on board and carried a
 man of fish with him and got Captain
 Davel and brought him on board the captain of
 the Phoenix left at half past 9 P.M. he took a
 back load of letters from us the second mate came
 on board at 2 o'clock with 2 bbls of fish At half
 past 9 o'clock hoisted forward and started for the
 Indian Ocean At 11 o'clock the island
 bore do West distant 25 miles Absolute on the
 weather bow at quarter before 12 o'clock
 single a reefed the topsails

Sunday January 28th 49

There is some fresh breezes and rainy
 But little doing through the day At 11 o'clock at 12
 double reefed the topsails
