

Onboard Bark *Cornelia* Davelin
 Concise description of the voyage commenced
 commenced September 11th 1848 at 9 o'clock
 Sept 23rd 5 o'clock at 11th got the waist boat started
 and when taking her in shipped a sea and
 carried away part of the bulwarks Touched at
 Poyah Oct. 7th and 10th at Pico Oct. 8th 11th 12th
 Truxado the 18th Oct. Dropped Anchor Dec 2nd at
 the Isl of St. to repair ship Left Dec 3rd
 November 28th a man by the name of John Banks
 fell from the maintop to the deck December 17th
 1848 about deck where he chooses December 27th
 crossed the line January 26 Touched at Truxado
 and got 29 bushels Jan 31st 1849 got the first water
 Tuesday February 21st 28th 1849 had a heavy gale of
 wind and carried away a part of the bulwarks May 9th
 the third mate got his leg hurt by a whale
 it was about 5 weeks healing up June
 12th dropped anchor at the Island of
 Zapherna and left July 2nd July 14th
 touched at the island of assumption The 18th
 20th and 21st went ashore on the island of Aldeia
 The 31st July and 1st of August went on to
 the Island of Aldeia for tortoise Beighman
 off duty from the 3rd of Aug to the 18th
 Arrived at the Island of Johanna Aug 30th and
 Left September 8th November 1st went a long the
 shores of the Island of Bassas de India and got 5 tort
 Saw Europa rocks November 1849 Nov 19th
 Bassas de India November December 1st 49 Saw Bassas
 de India the 2nd 3rd 4th went a shore a wooding on the
 N^W side of the Island Doubled the capes of good hope
 on our out ward bound passage Feb 15th 1850
 On the return passage February 23rd 1850
 February 14th a man named R Townley fell from the main
 yard to the main back but was able to return to duty
 on the 26th

Bark *Cornelia* Indian Ocean
 March 5th Monday 1849

First part fresh breeze and squally but no
 fresh breeze and cloudy hours. Wind S E
 11th At 4 o'clock took a lower observation by
 observing the distance of the sun from the mer
 tended the main topgallant sail and single
 reefed the fore topsail At 11 o'clock
 for topsail and cooper heard saw
 gampuses and saw white water
 Saw a ship bound to westward probably a Indian

Tuesday March 6th 1849

The 24 hours fresh breeze unchanged course
 Wind S W 11th Wind S E
 11th Saw a sail and had almost a continual
 billowing white water and vesicles all for nothing
 Mended the cabin steps sent out the waist boat

Wednesday March 7th 1849

First part fresh breeze last part small breeze
 and clear course at 11th Wind S E
 11th At 10 o'clock a new line at 6 o'clock single
 reefed the fore and main topsails At 11 o'clock
 he raps out of the topsails histing over the old
 maintopgallant sail to make a fore topgallant
 sail Run a new line at half past eleven
 Saw a sail

Thursday March the 8th 1849

These 24 hours fresh breeze last part the same
 Tack and tack Wind S E
 11th At 11 o'clock on the fore topgallant sail at 5
 o'clock spoke the ship Martha of New Bedford
 Fair haven
