

Barck Cornelia N. B. Indian Ocean

Thursday March 8th 1849 concluded

A. M. Finished mending the topgallant sail and commenced to mend a topsail saw a sail to boat

Friday March 9th 49

These 24 hours fresh breezes and cloudy weather Course South South East

P. M. Finished mending the topsail at seven single reefed the maintopsail A. M. Making new futtack sheaves to the fore topgallant rigging and at work on the whaling apparatuses

Saturday March 10th 49

These 24 hours small breezes and squally Course East wind from North to East

P. M. A. work on the mail whaling apparatus and strapping the wheel rope blocks etc at 6 O'clock saw a sail to Southward A. M. Broke out for bread and water at 5 O'clock saw a Barque with a main sky sail bound to the South west she was low black and very rakish

Sunday March 11th 49

First part small breezes Last part fresh breeze and cloudy Course E by N Wind S S W

P. M. Pracking out to see how much water there is on board and to cook bread untied the fore topsail and sent another up in its place sent out the new starter boat and loosed the old one at sunset hoisted the main course A. M. saw a bark

Monday March 12th 1849

These 24 hours fresh breezes and cloudy Course E by N Wind S E by S P. M. Took a lunar observation by measuring the distance of the sun from jupiter from the moon A. M. at work on the whaling apparatuses

Tuesday March 13th 49

Lat These 24 hours fresh breezes course

West Wind S. East

P. M. Making spinnaker and mended the jib and fore topsails stay sail repaired the service on the jib.endants and staysail sheets at night double reefed the topsails and hauled the main course commenced standing boats crew watches A. M. Broke out the run for the whaling cutlery and cleaned blubber and towed them in the run again

Wednesday March 14th 49

These 24 hours fresh breezes and cloudy weather Course from south east to N. Wind variable

P. M. Mending boatsail etc. At 3 O'clock saw blackfish at 4 raised land hoisting that it was the south east part of Madagascar near Port Dauphin at 7 O'clock double reefed topsails and set boats crew watches P. M. broke out for the deck foot and flukes chains and cleaning them
