These 24 hours small breezes and clear weather
 Working to Westward Wind E by N
 P.M. Making spun yarn sennett and repairing
 the line tub stages and making a new cooler cover
 at 10 had a great noise to mast head for naught
 Making sennett for hunt gaskets and for
 service

Friday April 6th , 49

These 24 hours fresh breezes and rainy course
 N.E. Wind South East
 these today making sennett and also work
 on hunt gaskets etc Lat 23 40

Saturday April 7th , 49

These 24 hours fresh breezes and squally weather
 P.M. making hunt gaskets heading sennett
 etc A.M. making hunt gaskets and sennett
 at half past 11 O'clock spoke Saver's Ship
 Lat 23. 16

Cornelia of N Bedford off Fort Dauphin Ocean
 Sunday April 8th 1849 These 24 hours fresh breezes
 cloudy weather Course T N W
 P.M. At 3 O'clock spoke the Ship Photion of
 N Bedford Capt. With 33 men out 800 to 1000
 and 200 Whale Lat 22. 46 South
 Land in sight

Monday April 9th , 49

These 24 hours fresh breezes and variable
 weather course Tack and tack
 At work on the whaling apparatuses etc
 the land hairs of P.P.C. distant 20 miles

Tuesday April 10th , 49

These 24 hours fresh gales and changeable Wind E
 tack and tack Variation two points
 P.M. at half past fore raised whales to
 windward distant one mile but they went
 down and was not seen after land hairs of W
 distant 35 miles at A.M. at work on the whaling
 apparatuses

Wednesday April 11th , 49

These 24 hours fresh breezes and squally
 tack and tack Wind East Variation 2 points
 P.M. at 3 O'clock saw a ship to windward
 making hunt gasket etc A.M. Repairing the
 fore topsail lifts and at work in the rigging

Thursday April 12th , 49

These 24 hours fresh breezes Tack and tack
 wind East Variation 2 points
 at 1/2 Ship in sight at 11 O'clock the
 the cry of thar she blows and lowered
