

Dark Councils of New Bedford off Fort Souther I Ce  
 Saturday May 19<sup>th</sup> 1849 First part of these  
 hours fresh breezes last part fresh gales Wind S E  
 P.M. Tryworks at eight o'clock Raised whales at 4  
 o'clock lowered the Larboard boat at 5 and at 6  
 struck one and killed him and got him along  
 side at eleven o'clock A.M. commenced to cut in the  
 whale back out for water



Sunday May 20<sup>th</sup> 49 Larboard boat  
 First part of these 24 hours fresh breezes last part  
 small breezes and clear Wind East & the East  
 P.M. Finished cutting in the body of of the whale  
 and cleared away the jaw and started the tryworks  
 at 3 o'clock A.M. the tryworks growing and stowing  
 down oil in the after hold Land to westward  
 distant 10 miles

Monday May 21<sup>st</sup> 49  
 These 24 hours fresh breezes and rains squalls from  
 our star  
 P.M. at 12 o'clock cooled down the try works to  
 take in the whales head on account of the land being  
 so very finished the head at 4 o'clock and started the  
 try works again the land that is nearest bears  
 west nor west distant 8 miles A.M. stowing down in  
 the after hold raised whales and lowered but with  
 out success the try works a growing Broke out  
 for flower Land 30 miles distant

Tuesday May 22<sup>nd</sup> 49  
 These 24 hours fresh breezes and cloudy  
 Course E by South wind to wind  
 the try works are a growing the stowing in the after  
 hold cut up the junk out A.M. finished trying  
 out

Councils of New Bedford off Fort Souther  
 Wednesday May 23<sup>rd</sup> 1849  
 First part of these 24 hours fresh gales <sup>with rain</sup>  
 the wind increased to a gale accompanied  
 P.M. stowed away casks and barrels etc in the  
 after hold and brok out for water Saw finbacks  
 A.M. Close respect the fore topsail got up the  
 fluk chutes and put them on the oil to lash  
 it

Thursday May 24<sup>th</sup> 49  
 These 24 hours fresh breezes and thunder  
 storms Wind E by East  
 P.M. Tiled the fore sail and to wash off from  
 the whaling apparatus to the Larboard boat  
 A.M. stowing down filed the scuttle  
 hets with water

Friday May 25<sup>th</sup> 49  
 These 24 hours small breeze and clear  
 weather Wind about West by North  
 P.M. stowing down saw finbacks  
 A.M. stowing down saw plenty of finbacks

Saturday May 26<sup>th</sup> 49  
 These 24 hours see fresh breeze and clear  
 Wind S by Course N E  
 P.M. finished stowing down the  
 Oil but left a large quantity of cask on  
 deck to stow down to encrow Broke out for  
 masses A.M. finished stowing down  
 the scuttle casks and commenced to wash  
 off the hull works etc. finbacks
