

Barque Laennec of New Bedford off Fort Dauphin
Sunday May 27th 1849

These 24 hours fresh breezes and squally
weather course East Wind S E
P.M. Finished washing of and scrubbed decks
Took the whales teeth out of 3 whales jaws
and mixed them and scrubbed decks again
and caught as many oliver coes as we chose
also at work on the whaling apparatus
All the Sabbath

Monday May 28th 49

These 24 hours fresh gales and rain
shows Wind south south east
At the Sabbath A.M. Serviced the
flake rope and at work on the whaling
apparatuses

Tuesday May 29th 49

These 24 hours fresh breezes accompanied with
rain squalls Wind S E Course S E
P.M. At work on the whaling apparatuses
A.M. at work on the whaling apparatuses
Land bearing south west distant 50 miles

Wednesday May 30th 49

First part of the 24 hours fresh breezes and rain squally
last part small breeze and calms course N E W
P.M. at work on the whaling apparatuses
At 5 o'clock fort Dauphin nearly west
distant about 20 miles the nearest land bears
west distant 10 miles A.M. Land within 15
miles lying to the nor west at work on
the whaling apparatuses

Barque Laennec of New Bedford of the mouth of
Carnegie channel

Thursday May 31st 1849

These 24 hours fresh small breezes and calms
Course West by South Variation and Leeward
P.M. at work in the foretop sail rigging
and at work on the whaling apparatuses
Land to the north distant 15 miles
A.M. Saw fin backs at work on the fore top
mast rigging and whaling apparatuses

Friday June 1st 49

These 24 hours small breezes and calms
Course S E Wind changeable
P.M. at work on the whaling apparatuses
and the fore top mast rigging saw fin backs
A.M. At work in the fore and main top masts
rigging

Saturday June 2nd 49

These 24 hours fresh breezes and squally
course North by west Wind fair
P.M. at work on the fore and main rigging
A.M. at work on the fore top sail rigging
and whaling apparatuses Lat 25° 6' South
Lon 43° 30' East

Sunday June 3rd 49

These 24 hours fresh breezes and clear
weather course N by E Wind nearly South
P.M. at work in the main top mast rigging and
the whaling apparatuses All the Sabbath
broke out for water
