

Bark Cornelia of N Bedford off in Mozambique
These 24 hours fine fresh breezes and clear weather
Wind SE course NE variation 20 degrees
Monday June 11th 1849

P.M. at 8 o'clock Mohilla bairs NE distant 20
miles at six o'clock doubled reefed the topsails
A.M. Shifted the anchors on the opposite bows and
got the shank painters in ready for dropping anchor
got up the plate-chains cables and bent them
on the anchors at 6 o'clock Mohilla bairs NE
distant 30 miles and Johanna Isle bairs NE
distant 45 miles We had a fine fair wind
that carried us along through the water to not
at least but we did not gain on the islands
over 2 nets

Tuesday June 12, 49

These 24 hours fresh breezes and clear course
A.M. Scraped the paint works of very spar
in the ship and scraped the dead eyes
at 4 o'clock saw a sail to the north
She appears to be drifting to the windward
at sun-down Mohilla bairs NE and
Johanna Isle bairs NE by E distant
20 miles at sundown reefed the top-sails
Sail spanker and main course and hauled
up the fore-course A.M. the old Cornelia dropped
the anchor about 12 o'clock

ing at the port of Jabanak
Tuesday June 12 Sived time
Broke out for coals and sent a raft
to shore and commenced to wash the
port side of the ship

June Wednesday 13th 49

These 24 hours fine clear weather
Got of a raft of water and scraped
and washed the ship one wash
shore on liberty myself and 3 more
went a gunning

June Thursday 14th 49

Fine clear weather These 24 hours
Blacked the bonds on the starboard side
Filled the starboard scuttle butts with
water Got 2 boat loads of wood
The starboard wash on shore on liberty

Friday June 15th 49

These 24 hours fine clear weather
Gave the masts on the starboard side
one other coat of paint and cut up
the wood The starboard wash on shore
on shore by grounding her on the
stones on the shore or rather the
mainmast had the try-ton sail to
lay The starboard wash
on liberty
