Friday July 6th 1849

P.M. at work mending the jib  
A.M. mending the jib

Saturday July 7th 49

These 24 hours fresh breezes and clear weather

P.M. went the jib the crains in the waist, soaked boat with the hose. A.M. Broke out for water saw finbacks

Sunday July 8th 49

These 24 hours fresh breezes and clear weather  
P.M. Saw a sperm whale and came within 2 miles of him at sundown  
haled 2 two fresh water buckets  
A.M. Sabbath

Monday July 9th 49

These 24 hours small breeze and clear weather  
Boys nearly East

The sabbath saw a breach  
A.M. took out for the old forecourse and for pork and beef and commenced to mend the forecourse

Tuesday July 10th 1849

fine fresh breezes and clear weather  
Course East Wind S.W. & S.E.

P.M. Unbent the forecourse and sent the old one up in its place and put the unbent forecourse into a cask and put it in the fore hold  
A.M. Broke out for the spanker and mended it also mending the boat that was stove in port

Wednesday July 11th 49

These 24 hours fresh breezes and clear weather

Wind east & East  
P.M. Unbent the spanker and sent up and old one in its place  
A.M. at work on the whaling apparatuses got the boat down from over head and washed her out

Thursday July 12th 49

These 24 hours fresh breezes and cloudy  
Course east Wind variable from S.W. to N.E.  
P.M. Broke out for mela-rose oil and oilsope  
A.M. at work on the chafing gear and whaling apparatuses  
bent the fore topgallant sail

Friday July 13th 49

These 24 hours fresh breezes and squally weather  
Wind from S.W. to North going  
P.M. Saw a water spout  
at work on the boats etc etc  
A.M. mostly every every mending his job
