Sunday August 26th 1849

These 24 hours fresh breeze and clear weather. The wind variable and the current setting.

P.M. Mending the stoven boat at all the Sabbath

Lat 12° 08' South

Lon 40° East

Monday August 27th 49

These 24 hours very light and calm with a fair wind from E to S. E. Course at East. P.M. The Sabbath at 5 o'clock raised blackfish and lowered the two quarter boats but without success. A broke out for water flour iron has. shocks and put the cooper setting up the shocks to put water in when we get in. put raised black fish and lowered the two quarter boats but without success.

Lat 11° 37' South

Tuesday August 28th 49

These 24 hours a little wind I think as I ever saw for the time. Clear weather.

P.M. The Cooper setting up shocks stowed of the fore main and after. Sailed at all the cooper setting up shocks. The fly jib gyes were found to be parted so we spliced a new piece of rigging into them and set them up. St. clearing the grass and iron rust off of the port side of the ship.

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Lat 11° 40' South

Wednesday August 29th 49

First part of these 24 hours calm middle and last part fresh gales and clear weather.

P.M. The cooper setting up casks. Finished scraping of the moss off the port side of the ship. Sailed at all the Lat 12° 10' South. The jib gyes making gaffs. Lon 41° 50' East.

Monday August 30th 1849

P.M. but little doing at all. Raised the Islands of Mohilla and Johannet at 12 o'clock within 2 miles of the land. These 24 hours fresh gales.

Lying at the Island of Johannet. The latter wood of Westport lay there. Dropped anchor Thursday August 30th 1849 at 2 o'clock P.M. furled the sails and commenced to break out for casks and sent a raft of 20 casks of for water and left them and broke out for every thing in the after hold on the Starboard side except the oil.

Friday 31 of August 49

Light breeze and fine clear weather.

Lying at the Island of Johannet. The Starboard watch ashore on liberty painted the heads on the Starboard side.

Saturday September 1st 49

Light breeze and fine clear weather. The Starboard watch ashore on liberty Blacked the heads on the Starboard side. got of two rafts of water and stowed the latter hold with water most of.
