P.M. saw sperm whales and the starboard
and Larboard boats got one each out in
the whales and

Starboard Boat Larboard Boat

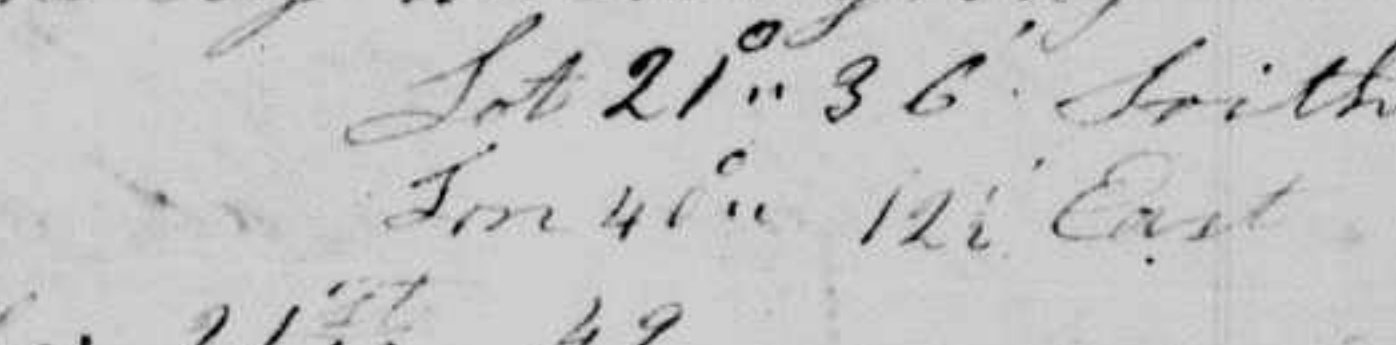
Friday Oct 19th 49

First part small breeze last part fresh gales
P.M. cut up the heads and started the
tryworks & all trying out.

Lon 48° 45' W

Saturday October 20th 49

small breeze and calm
P.M. saw sperm whales lowered and
the Larboard boat got one still
within the whale the tryworks going

 28 fms  21° 36' South
Lon 48° 12' East

Sunday October 21st 49

small breeze and fine clear weather
P.M. the tryworks a going & all trying out
saw whales but they were going faster than
arail road broke out for shocks and shock
heads and hoops and set up 4 shooes

 Squair headed grampuses

Monday October 22nd 49

First part of this 24 hours small breeze last part
finished trying out the blubber
saw breeches & all commenced to stow down

Lat 21° 26' N
Lon 48° 58' W

Tuesday October 23rd 1849

24 hours small breeze and calm very fine
P.M. Stowing down oil also he has
for two casks of oil to cooper saw
grampuses & all saw sperm at 6

 Calbeck lowered at eight but
without success the mate

at lashed the one of the foremast
hand with a coopers driver but soon
dropped it and a scuffle ensued
accompanied with blows on both
sides the mate succeeded in

beating him and picked on him
and pounded him and choked
him until the Captain rescued
him The man is an Irishman

by the name of John Bayles the
Mate (Mr Macomber) has treated
him very abusive he has been the
sole cause of his falling from

aloft and has injured his mental
faculties very much besides injuring
his bodily faculties in short he
can be considered but little short of

a crippled idiot the mate as picked
a pon him and fought him more
than a score of times which he never

at tempted to defend himself until
his reason was hurt as above stated
The Captain severely reprimanded him
in the presence of all hands and gave

him his orders not to strike a nather
more the veige
