

Bark *Cornelia* of New Bedford at St. Helena
 Thursday the 4th of April 1850.
 Fresh breeze and squally weather. The starboard
 wash in shore on liberty. Finished painting from
 the ship on the starboard side. Stowed the
 casks filled the scuttle butts with water
 washed decks &c

Friday April 5th 1850

Fresh breeze and clear weather. Bent sails got
 every thing ready for leaving the anchor.
 One man in the starboard wash did not
 come off at the appointed time so the Captain
 has stopped the liberty of all hands in time by
 contrary to his promise he promised to
 stop the mans liberty who should not
 come on board at the appointed time but
 in stead of that he stopped all of the rest of
 their liberty and let the rest transit con-
 tinued on shore. Also let the third man go
 on shore and stopped until morning
 which has incited the crew to mutiny
 nearly. We have got two boats load
 of wood. The brig *Pilot* of Boston that
 came in here lately was condemned. Two
 vessels came in here today

Saturday April 6th 1850

Brought of a fine recruits waid anchor and left
 port. Stowed the anchors cables &c two vessels
 sailed and arrived in port. weighed anchor
 at 4 p.m. Broke out for pork and beef

Friday April 12th 1850

I'll repairing the apparatuses &c
 at 11 I'll the Helena at 30 miles

Saturday April 13th 1850

There were fresh gales and cloudy weather
 I'll mending the bark. I'll at work the
 apparatuses at 11 the bark again it is in the
