Friday April 26th 1850

Small breeze and fine clear weather

P.M. cut the whale into horse pieces and started the trawls. Sailed to the south
It was trying out saw two sails

Saturday April 27th 1850

Small breeze and fine clear weather

P.M. finished trying out and had a game with two Barks one the Concordia of Sugar
her ^{6 mo out} barge with 50 bbls of whale oil Capt
French the other Bark Sarah of Matapoiset
Capt. & Mather 18th mo with 750 sperm and
40 hump back ~~to~~ ke out for sugar and sperm
oil still but little doing Lat 16° 30' South
Lon 3° 31' West

Sunday

Saturday April 28th 1850

Small breeze and fine clear weather

P.M. gained with the Concordia of Sugar
Capt. French 6 mo 40 bbls of hump back oil
A.M. two whaling ships in sight

Sunday April 29th 1850

These 20 hours fresh breezes

P.M. saw two merchant ships A.M.
stowed down the oil broke
out for beef and pork Lat 17° 56' South
Lon 4° 46' West

Tuesday April 30th 1850

Small breeze and squally

P.M. ground the spade washed ship & S.
A.M. towing the barge mended the
try works made spinnaker

Wednesday May 1st 1850

These 20 hours fresh breezes and squally

P.M. making ratline staff A.M. making
spinnaker & Lat 17° 16' South
Lon 4° 05' West

Thursday May 2nd 1850

Fresh gales and squally South reefed heads
P.M. making spinnaker repairing castles
saw 3 other whaling boats to the
ward A.M. drawing yarns and making
spinnaker saw a small man to the ward

Friday May 3rd 1850

Fresh gales and clear weather Doubled reefed to sail
P.M. continued making spinnaker
had a game with the Sarah of Matapoiset
Capt. Mather A.M. at work on the whaling
apparatus & Lat 16° 49' South
Lon 3° 36' West

Saturday May 4th 1850

Fresh gales and squally South reefed topsails
P.M. making new fly jib, pendulum A.M.
making nettles seizing staff & saw a whaling
to the wind ward Lat 17° 34' S
Lon 3° 35' W

Sunday May 5th 1850

Fresh gales and showery Doubled reefed topsails
P.M. saw hump backs A.M. the sabbath

Monday May 6th 1850

Fresh breezes and squally weather
P.M. the sabbath A.M. making spinnaker
and french sennet Lat 17° 31' South
Lon 3° 45' West

Tuesday May 7th 1850

Fresh gales Flirted the worst boat on the coast
P.M. making spinnaker and sennet Lat 17° 31' South
Lon 2° 48' West
