lower studding sail steering South East
Lat by Ob 44.38 South Lon by Lunar 14.36 West

Thursday February the 21st 1851 These Last 24 hours
P.M. Fine clear weather Nothing going on
Ship steering South East A.M. moderate breeze and
rainy weather the Trustees Greenland is sight the wind
South Nothing going on of any account

Friday February the 22nd 1851 These Last 24 hours
Small breezes and rainy looking off the coast of Greenland
A.M. Strong breezes and squally looking up toward the base of
of Greenland Nothing going on of any account

Saturday February the 23rd 1851 These Last 24 hours
P.M. Fresh gale and squally looking toward the land
and at 10 o'clock the Bark Odd fellow of Sag Harbor Capt
Hodge six months out with two hundred and eighty bbls
of sperm and three hundred and twenty of whale on the
coast of Africa breeze and for some and ginned water for

Sunday February the 24th 1851 These Last 24 hours
Strong breezes and clear weather the Captain and second
mate went on shore with the waist busts crew and two
and of the men runaway but all got them the next day
P.M. the mate went up fishing

Monday February the 25th 1851 These Last 24 hours
Small breezes and fine clear weather the Captain
went on shore and got about eighty bushels of potatoes
six hogs and three geese three hens and a goat
In the afternoon went on shore brought the Captain on board
and at 10 o'clock potatoes

Tuesday February the 26th 1851 These Last 24 hours
Strong breezes and foggy weather Nothing in sight
A.M. towing potatoes in buckets and hanging them under
the main head busts A.M. saw a sulfur bottom
Lat by Ob 38.16 South Lon by Lunar 7.52 East

Thursday February the 27th These Last 24 hours
Fresh gale and pleasant weather Broke out
in the forenoon for water and in the afternoon for pork
and beef flower and sugar saw grampasses steering
East A.M. Strong breezes and pleasant saw grampasses
steering East by North wind N. W. East
Lat by Ob 38.16 South Lon by Lunar 5.2 West
