Thursday June 12th These 24 hours first part
moderate breeze and fine clear weather nothing
in sight wind S.W. Steering N.E. at work on the
fore top rigging breaking and stowing the Store dyes

Lat by Ob 14° 37' S Lon by Chro 43° 38' E

Friday June 13th 41 These 24 hours first part

breeze and fine clear weather raised the Commodore's

to the wind S.W. P.M. first part calm and light breeze
and spots of rain dropped and clear at Johnnakin 2 o'clock
perked the sails and theist but went on shore

Monday June 16th 41 These 24 hours first part
moderate breeze and fine clear weather Star board hoath
on shore broke out for water P.M. bent them on shore
and filled them with water wind S.W.

Tuesday June 17th 41 These 24 hours first part
fresh gale and squally with sperm oil in barrel
with on shore got off a drift of water and stowed it in the
main hole I arrived at Johnnakin June the 18th
Capt. Lee 39 months out with 13 hundred of sperm
and 2 hundred of humpback Bound home and
The Bark Dove of New London Capt. Foresight
22 months out with eight hundred bbls of sperm
