wind W. course N.W. all sail set. fresh gales and clear weather
one sail in sight to leeward and another to leewardward balling off your
wind N by W. course by the wind. Lat by Ob 5 4 S

Thursday February 12th 52 These fresh gales and clear weather
at work on the whaling operates wind N.W. by N. All fresh breezes and
squally making spungarn wind from land to N.W. Lat by Ob 5 9 S

Friday February 13th 52 These fresh gales and squally spoke the
bark James of London Capt Terry rose new maintop gallant
haliards wind from N.W. to N. course N.W. All fresh gales and
squally with rain making spungarn wind N.W. by W. course N.W. by W

Saturday February 14th 52 These 24 hours fresh breezes and
squally covering castles wind N by W. broke out for heads
All strong breezes and squally two sails in sight covering all castles
wind N.W. by W. course N.W. Lat by Ob 1 5 S

Sunday February 15th 52 These 24 hours strong breezes and
squally broke out for ports wind N.W. by W. All strong breezes
and squally sails in sight wind N.W. Lat by Ob 0 50 S

Monday February 16th 52 These 24 hours small breezes and
squally saw blackfish wind W.N.W. All small breezes and clear weather
saw ship back setting upshots wind W. course N.W. Lat by Ob 5 2 S

Tuesday February 17th 52 These 24 hours small breezes and squally with
rain making spungarn with sawillers and bark to leeward wind N.W. by W
All fresh gales and heavy squalls bark in sight but the maintop gallant
sail and sent it down and sent up anew one wind N.W. by W
course by the wind tack and tack

Thursday February 19th 52 These 24 hours strong breezes and squally broke out
for sails sent anew fore top sail and put the old one below
the mate struck one of the fore most hands with his fist number of times
on the fore top sail yards with out any provocation whatever wind N.W. All strong
breezes and squally ripped up the old main top gallant sail wind N.W.
