 Wednesday May 3rd 52 the starboard watch milled away
 painting ship clear weather small breezes and calm
 at half past four P.M. we received intelligence the captain
 sent the pleasure masters and about sunset took us to the
 or pleasure office and then after tea the P.M. wanted that we should
 go on board but we told them that we would not and so they put
 in the calaboose and we told them that would stay there and
 see to see out the same authority that put us in

Thursday May 4th the captain took us out at 6 A.M. saying that
 it was not his orders that we were put there and we went on board
 the starboard watch went on shore at 10 A.M. the steward and first mate had a
 was put in irons but at 10 A.M. the mate let him go and at 6 P.M.
 steward asphyxiated ran away caring their clothing with them

Friday May 5th 52 two boys of from a wrecked ship and another
 from Holston. Maf's shiped three chinamen

Saturday May 6th 52 blacking the keels taking water on board

Sunday May 7th 52 raining ship to men that left the
 sailing gale of Boston

Monday May 8th 52 the captain and on shore stowing of the fuel

Tuesday May 9th 52 the day wind anchor and made sail but the wind
 being light we lowered the boats and towed twice and we went out two
 miles and dropped anchor and pulled the sails and at half past ten
 the captain came along side and brought the cooper who belonged
 to the harem small breezes

Wednesday May 10th 52 these 24 hours small breezes and calm
 at 11 A.M. we made anchor and stood out to sea the Chinese at night calm
 we lowered and towed and at 7 P.M. we dropped anchor and changed
 the sails

Port of New Bedford in the passage from Hong Kong
 May 10th we made anchor and stood out to sea the pilot of the ship
 and had nothing worthy of remarks

May 11th 52 these 24 hours first part small breezes last strong breeze

Saturday May 12th 52 these 24 hours fresh gale and rainy

Sunday 13th 52 May 13 course E by N wind from N.E. to S.W. strong
 fresh gales and rainy nothing in sight for 40 miles and
 at 10 A.M. small breezes and rainy P.M. winds ceased to

Monday May 14th 52 These 24 hours fresh gales and rainy
 wind from N.W. to S.W. course E. S. M. fresh gale and rainy

Tuesday May 15th 52 These 24 hours small breezes and
 rainy at 3 o'clock P.M. raised land A.M. fresh breezes and rainy
 wind from N.E. to S. Lat by Ob 22. 1/2 N

Wednesday May 16th 52 These 24 hours small breezes and calm
 P.M. broke out for 1/2 between the bashes I saw a number
 fishing boats wind almost all around the compass A.M. fresh gales and
 clear blacking the cable wind N.W. by W course S.E. and E by N
 22. 24

Thursday May 17th 52 These 24 hours small breezes and clear A.M.
 blacking the cable broke out for flour winds N.W. course S.E. A.M.
 small breezes and clear over hallowing potatoes winds N.W. courses
 S.E. and S.W. all said Lat by Ob 22. 03 N

Friday May 18th These 24 hours S.W. strong breezes
 and clear passed bashes and racks winds N.W. course S.E.
 stowing away potatoes A.M. fresh gales from N.W. course S.E.
 the cooper working casks overhallowing the lanterns
 Lat by Ob 22. 11 Long Chen
