First part light
breezes from the S. Middle and
latter fine weather saw Kimbuck's
and several sail Lat 33° 14' N.
Long by Sr 72° 59' W
by Cr 72° 27' W

Wednesday May 9th

First part light breezes
from the S. Middle light from
the South and S W saw several sail
Lat 32° 50' N.
Long 73° 33' W

Thursday May 10th

First part light breezes
from the S. Middle and latter
moderate breezes from the Westward
saw a Schooners mainmast
Lat 33° 02' N

Friday May 11th

First part light breezes
from the Westward Middle and
latter fresh breezes from the N
Lat 32° 50' N

Saturday May 12th

First part fresh breezes
from the Westward Middle same
latter wind from the N with rain
and heavy squalls

Sunday May 13th

All this 24 hours
light winds and Calms at 5 P.M.
Spoke Schooner Ellen Proctor
Leamsterk clear Lat 31° 49' N
Long 71° 18' W

Monday May 14th 1866

First part Calm
Middle and latter light breezes
from S.W.

Tuesday May 15th

First part gentle breeze
from S.W. Middle and squally
and rainy wind to the Eastward

Wednesday May 16th

First part strong
winds from the Eastward Middle
and latter much the same
Lat 31° 18' N
Long 72° 58' W

Thursday May 17th

First part fresh
breezes from S.W. Middle and latter
light winds from E and Southwesterly
Lat 30° 43' N
Long 69° 41' W

Friday May 18th

First part light airs
from the South Middle gentle breeze
from the South latter fresh breezes
from the South with light rain
Lat 31° 01' N
Long 68° 51' W

Saturday May 19th

First part strong
winds from S by E and thick weather
Middle same latter strong gales
from the South ship under short
sail saw a Bark steering to the
Eastward
Lat 31° 41' N
Long 63° 38' W
