

Friday June 1st 1868 First part light
breezes from the South Middle
and latter light airs and
Calms Lat 31° 48' N

Saturday June 2d All these 24 hours
very light airs and Calms
Lat

Sunday June 3d First part Calms
Middle and latter very light
airs from the West and Calms
Lat 32° 02' N
Long 56° 34' W

Monday June 4th First part Calms
Middle and latter light airs
from the West and Calms
Saw two Merchant men
Lat 32° 09' N

Tuesday June 5th First part light
breezes from N. Middle and
latter gentle breezes from
N. W. with showers of rain
Lat 32° 46' N
Long 48° 20' W

Wednesday June 6th First part gentle
breezes from N. W. Middle and
latter strong winds from N. W.
and ruggia Lat 33° 41' N
Long by Gun 47° 18' W
Long by Chron 47° 18' W

Thursday June 7th 1868 First part fresh
Gales from N. W. Middle and
latter more moderate from
N. W. to N. E. Lat 34° 04' N
Long 43° 12' W

Friday June 8th First part moderate
breezes from N. E. and N. W.
Middle same latter light breezes from
the South and West with light showers
of rain at 3 past 11 saw a breach to
leeward No Obs

Saturday June 9th First part light airs and Calms
at 2 P. M. lowered for sperm Whales and
took one at 6 P. M. got the whale to the
ship and got ready for cutting commenced
through the night at daylight hooked
on thus ended cutting Lat 34° 50' N
Long 44° 40' W

Sunday June 10th First part light breezes
with considerable swell at 6 past five
got the Case on Deck Middle part
moderate at 8 A. M. lowered and
took a Whale at 11 took him to the
Ship and got ready for cutting
Lat 34° 55' N
44-44 W

Monday June 11 First part moderate em-
ployed in cutting and boiling got
the head off and one blanket piece
on Deck Middle and latter fresh breeze
from the South employed boiling and
cutting blubber Lat 35° 01' N
