

Tuesday July 3rd 1863

First part light breezes from the Eastward saw a number Merchantmen and one Steamer Middle and latter wind and weather about the same picked up a 40 Gallon Cask Carcass

Wednesday July 4th

First part light breeze from ESE to SE Middle and latter light air from from the Eastward saw about a dozen Merchant Ships also saw Humpbacks and Finbacks

Thursday July 5th

First part light air from the Eastward saw a large Steamer Middle and latter light air from the E saw several Merchantmen

Lat 37° 31' N
Long 39° 42' W

Friday July 6th

First part gentle breeze from the North Middle light breeze from the N with showers of rain latter same

Lat 36° 23' N
Long 40° 47' W

Saturday July 7th

First part light breezes from the North Middle and latter very light air and Calms saw one Merchantman

Long 41° 22' W

Sunday July 8th 1863

First part light breezes from NSE Middle and latter fresh breezes from NSE

Monday July 9th

First part fresh breezes from the Westward Middle strong winds latter strong westerly gales with heavy squalls

Lat 38° 25' N
Long 41° 04' W

Tuesday July 10th

First part strong westerly gales ship lying too near storm sails Middle same latter quite moderate

Lat 38° 02' N
Long 40° 50' W

Wednesday July 11th

First part moderate but squally Middle squally with thick weather saw several Merchantmen latter same one Brig in sight a Whaler

Lat 40° 05' N
Long 39° 36' W

Thursday July 12th

First part moderate winds from the N with thick weather at 4 PM spoke Brig John Hatherway. Huskins Fairhaven two weeks out clear Middle and latter light winds from the N the John Hatherway and one Merchantman in sight
