winds from the North saw
one Sail Middle and latter
strong breezes from the N and
N.E. one ship in sight Lat 11-40 N
Saw Corvo bearing S by W
Lat 40-19
Long 31-30 W

Tuesday July 24th First part strong
breezes from N.E. to E at 4 P
N spoke ship Herald
New Bedford to Bbb this season
Middle and latter strong breezes
from the Eastward steering for
Flores

Wednesday July 25th First part fresh
winds from the Eastward at 1 PM
went on shore at Santa Cruz at
7 came on board Middle and latter
fresh Easterly wind at 8 A.M. went
on shore

Thursday July 26th First part fresh breeze
from E. at 4 P.M. came on board
and stood out by the wind to the
South Middle and latter brisk
breezes from E to E.S. Lat 38-20 N
Long 30-20 W

Friday July 27th First part strong breezes
from from E. saw Pico Middle
and latter strong breezes from E.S.
E to N.E. saw great quantities of
Grampus Killers and Porpoises
Lat 38-11 N
Long 30-00

Saturday July 28th 1853 First part strong breeze
saw many quantities of Killers
Grampus and Porpoises Middle
and latter fresh breezes from the
E to N.E. Hayat an Pico in sight
Lat 38-09 N
Long 29-14 W

Sunday July 29th First part fresh breezes
from the N.E. Eastward saw Grampus
Middle strong winds latter moderate
breezes from the N.E. Eastward
Lat 38-24 N
Long 29-44 W

Monday July 30th First part moderate breeze
is from the N.E. Middle and latter
fresh breezes from the North. Employed
you hoisting out and cooping the
oil to send on shore

Tuesday July 31st First part strong
breezes from the N.E. run in of
the Flako of Hayat landed two sick
men and discharged them at 9 AM
got the oil into the lighter fresh breeze
from the N.E. through night

Wednesday Aug 1st First part fresh breezes
from the N.E. Middle same Middle
and latter brisk breezes from S.E. Breeze
beating into the passage

Thursday Aug 2^d First part light air and
calms at 4 P.M. got through on shore and
came on board leaving the one man a
custer and run out to the South and
