Friday Aug 3rd First part calm at 2 PM
a light breeze from N. E. Barks
by the wind to the N. W. Middle and
latter light air from E. S. E. at 9 A
M saw Flores also saw many Gramp
seas and Killers

Saturday Aug 4th First part light breezes
from E. S. E. Flores and Corvo in sight
Middle and latter gentle breezes from
the N. E. saw a Bark lying off and
on at Corvo

Sunday Aug 5th First part fresh breezes
at 3 P. M. went on shore on West
side Flores for recruits thus Enes
Bark lying off and on

Monday Aug 6th Gentle breezes from
N. E. Barks lying off and on for
recruits

Tuesday Aug 7th First part gentle breezes
at 8 P. M. got the recruits all on
board and headed by the wind
to the Mosquera Middle and latter
light breezes from the North Flores
and Corvo in sight

Wednesday Aug 8th First part light air from
the N. Middle and latter light air from
E. to S. Flores and Corvo in sight saw
one sail and plenty of Grampseas

Thursday Aug 9th 1858 First part light
breezes from the South Middle and
latter same saw the head of a sperm
Whale sent a Boat to it and cut out
an Iron marked B. & P. thus Enes
Flores and Corvo in sight

Friday Aug 10th First part light air from
the South Middle mostly calm latter
moderate breezes from South and by M
one sail in sight Lat 39° 4' N
Long 29° 54' W

Saturday Aug 11th First part gentle breezes from
S. S. W. saw a Barkentine Middle and
latter light breezes from the South
Lat 40° 03' N
Long 28° 31' W

Sunday Aug 12th First part light air from
South to E. S. E. Middle and latter light
breezes from S. S. E. and Calmes Pico in
sight

Monday Aug 13th First part gentle breezes
from S. S. E. Middle and latter same
Fayal in sight bearing N. E. dist
50 miles

Tuesday Aug 14th First part light breezes
from the South passed the Bark
Maria of Cotte Middle and latter
very light air from the South
and Calmes with slight rain
Esaciosa in sight Lat 39° 20' N
Long 28° 14' W
